

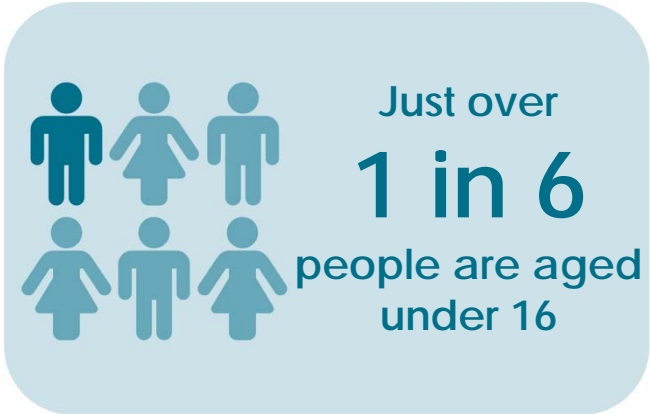

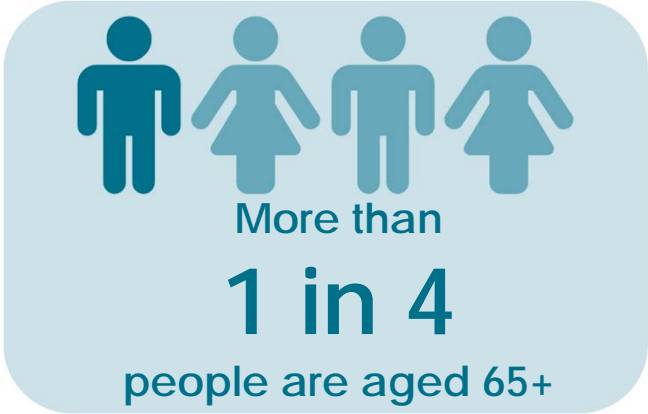

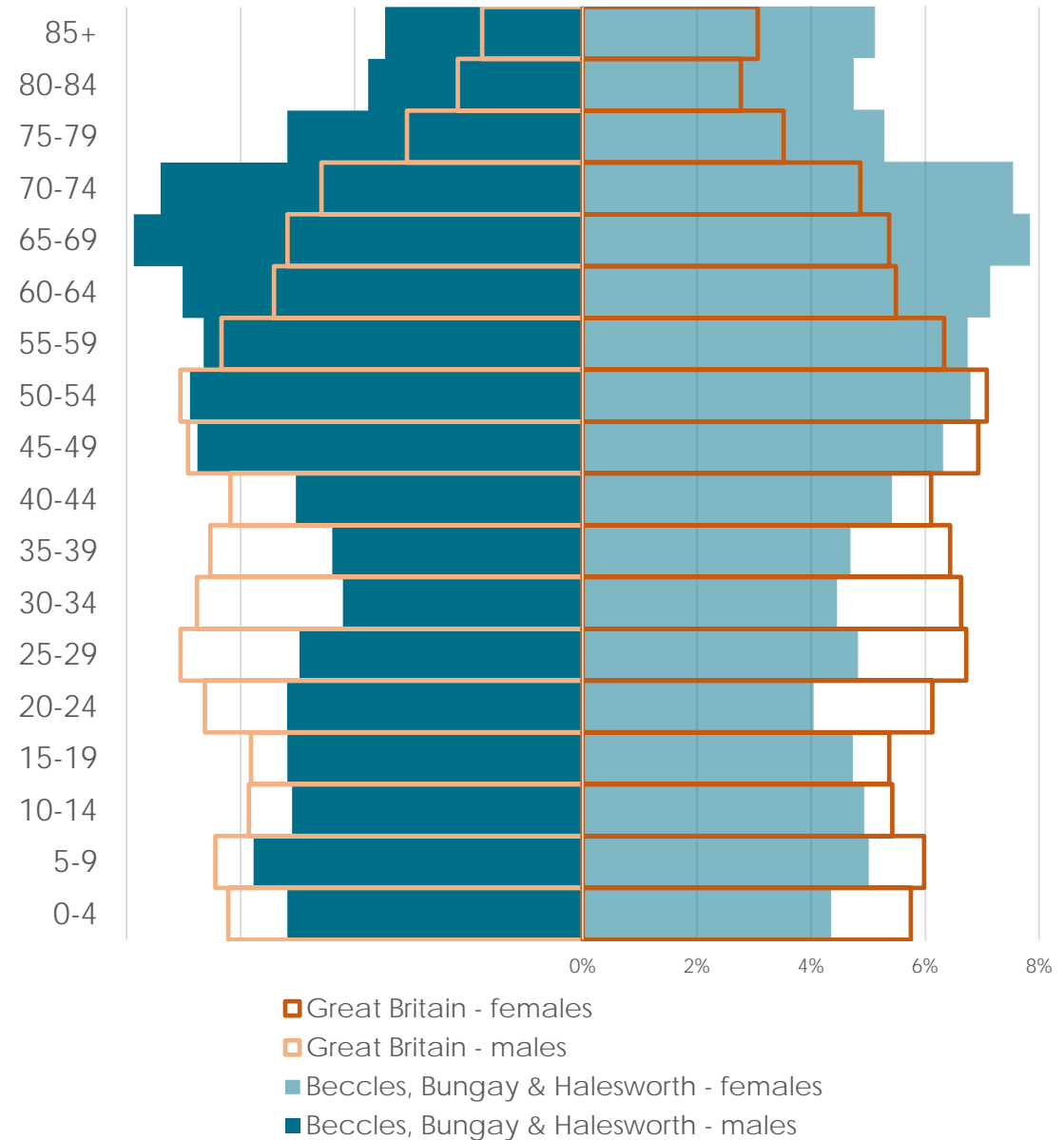
Population Age breakdown

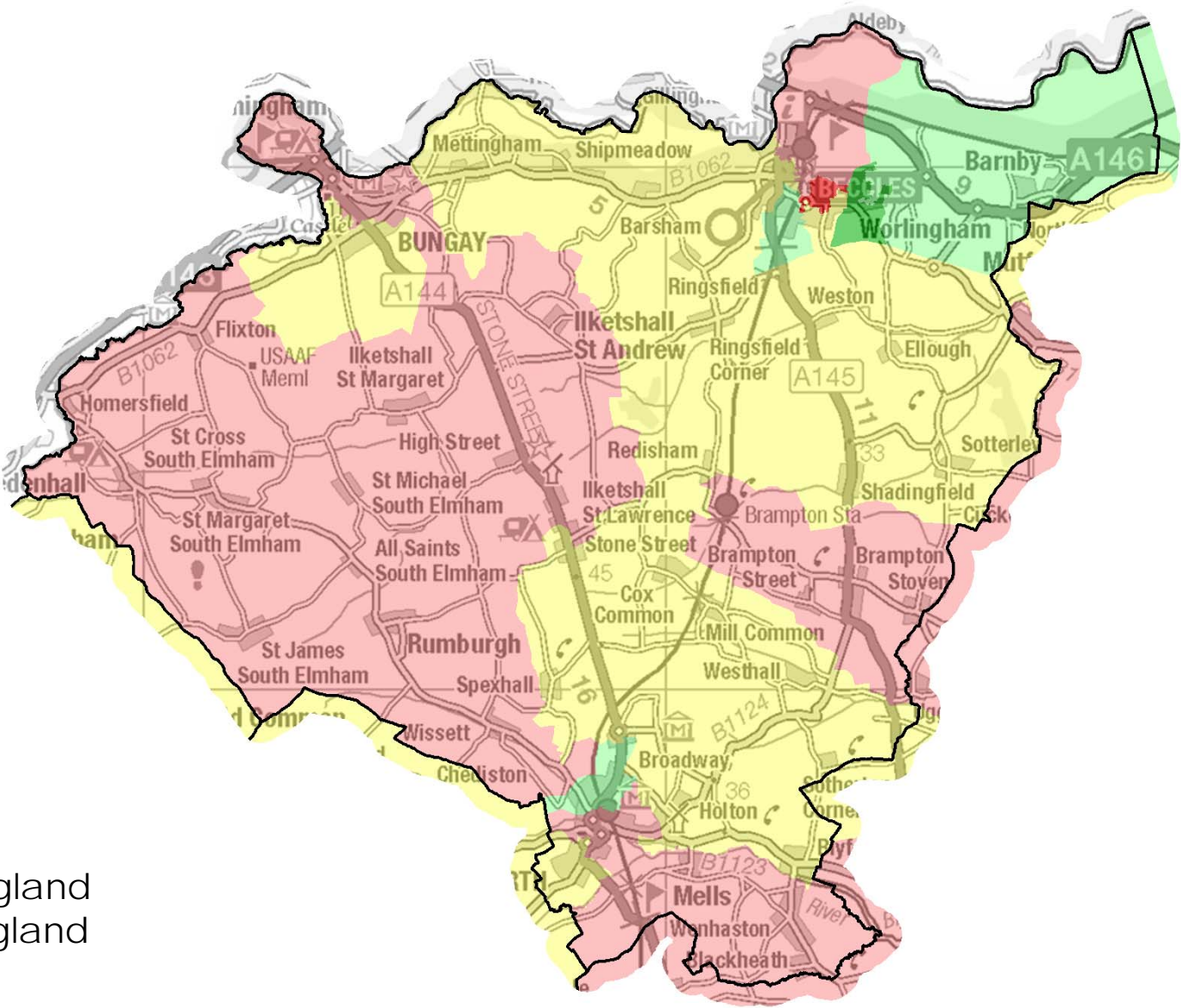

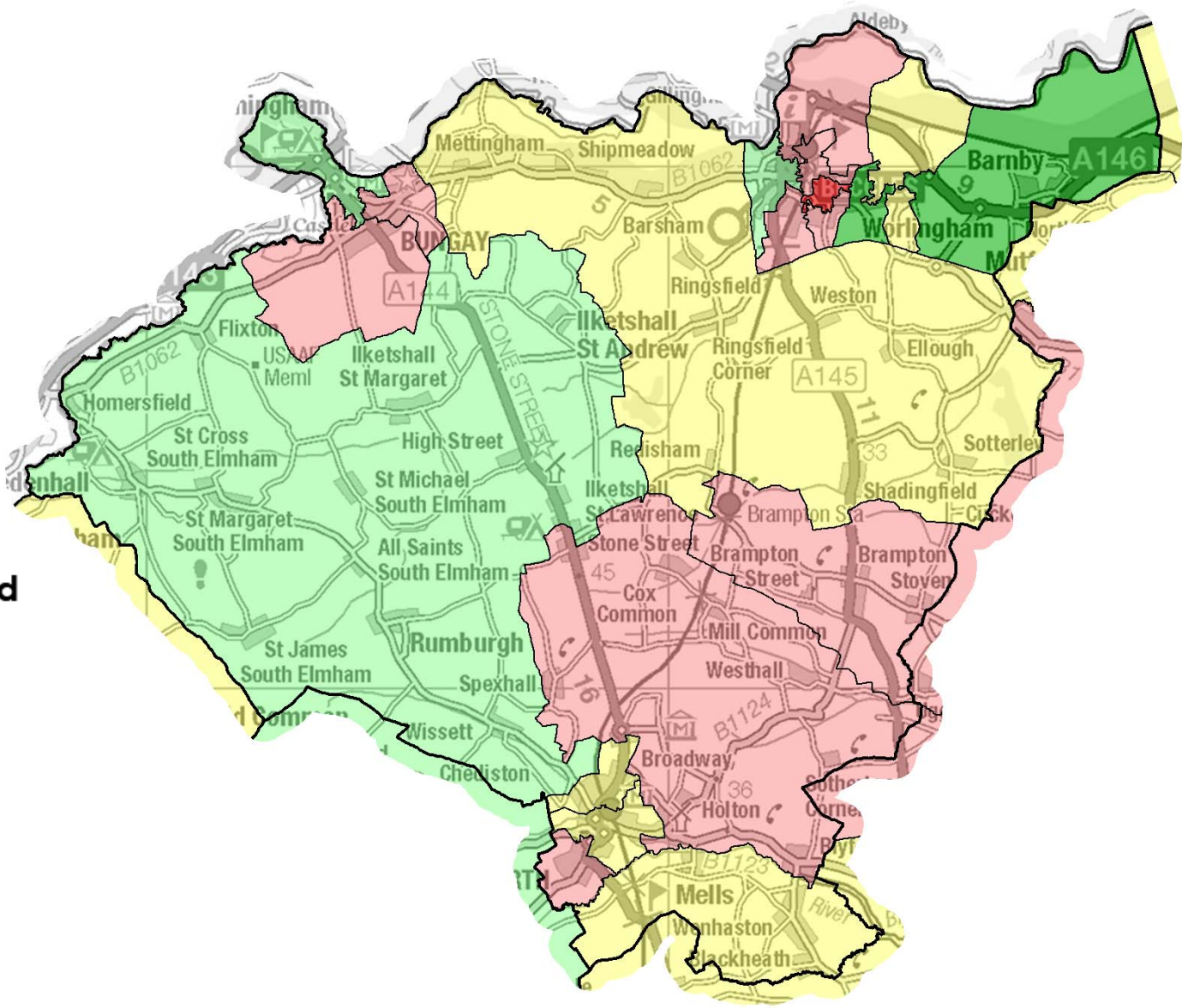

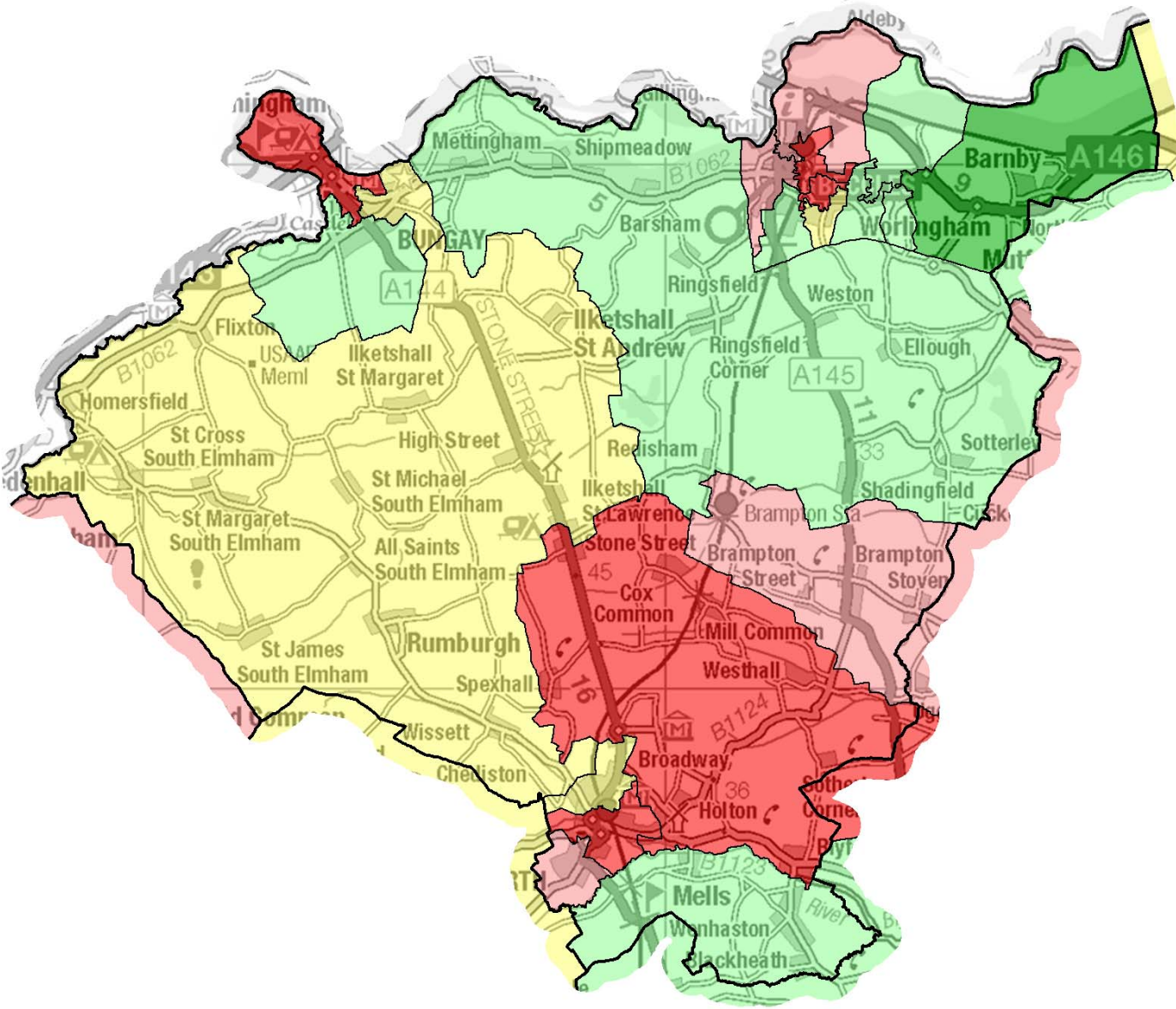
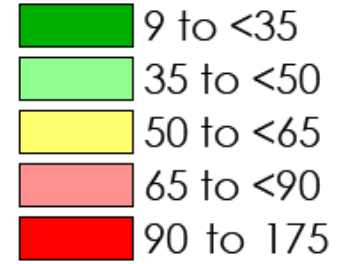
Children aged 0-15 income deprived

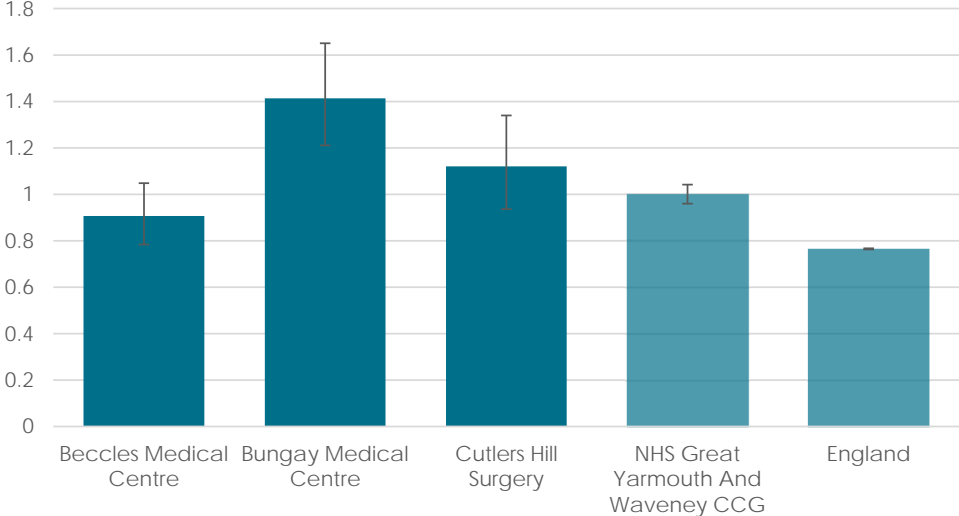

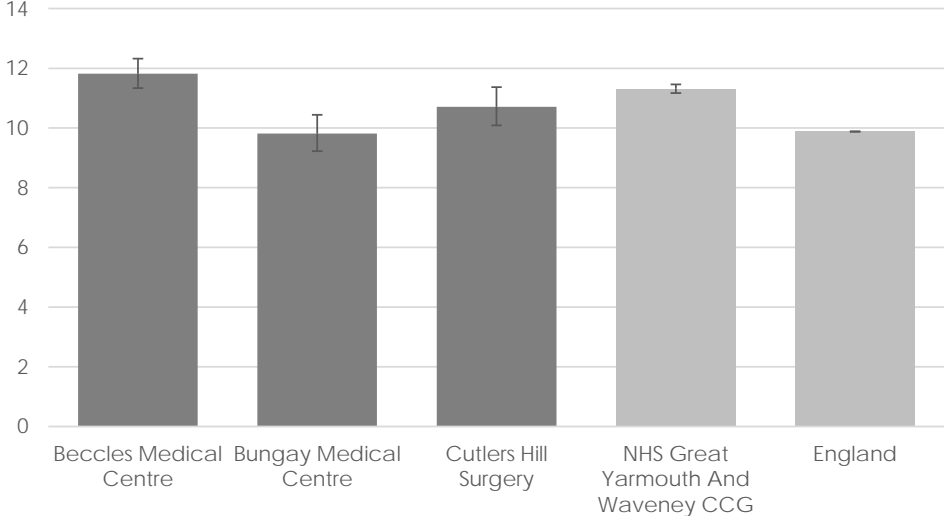
Mental health

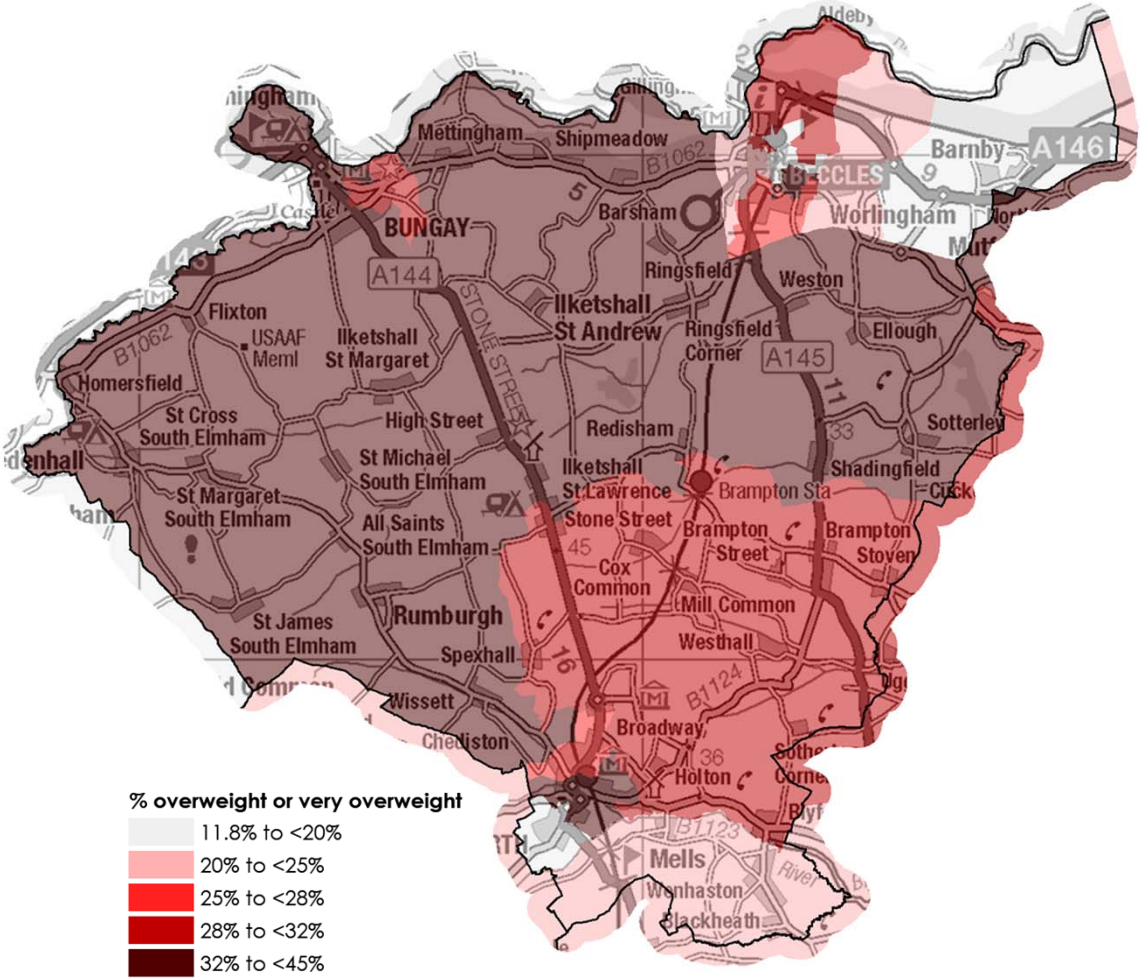

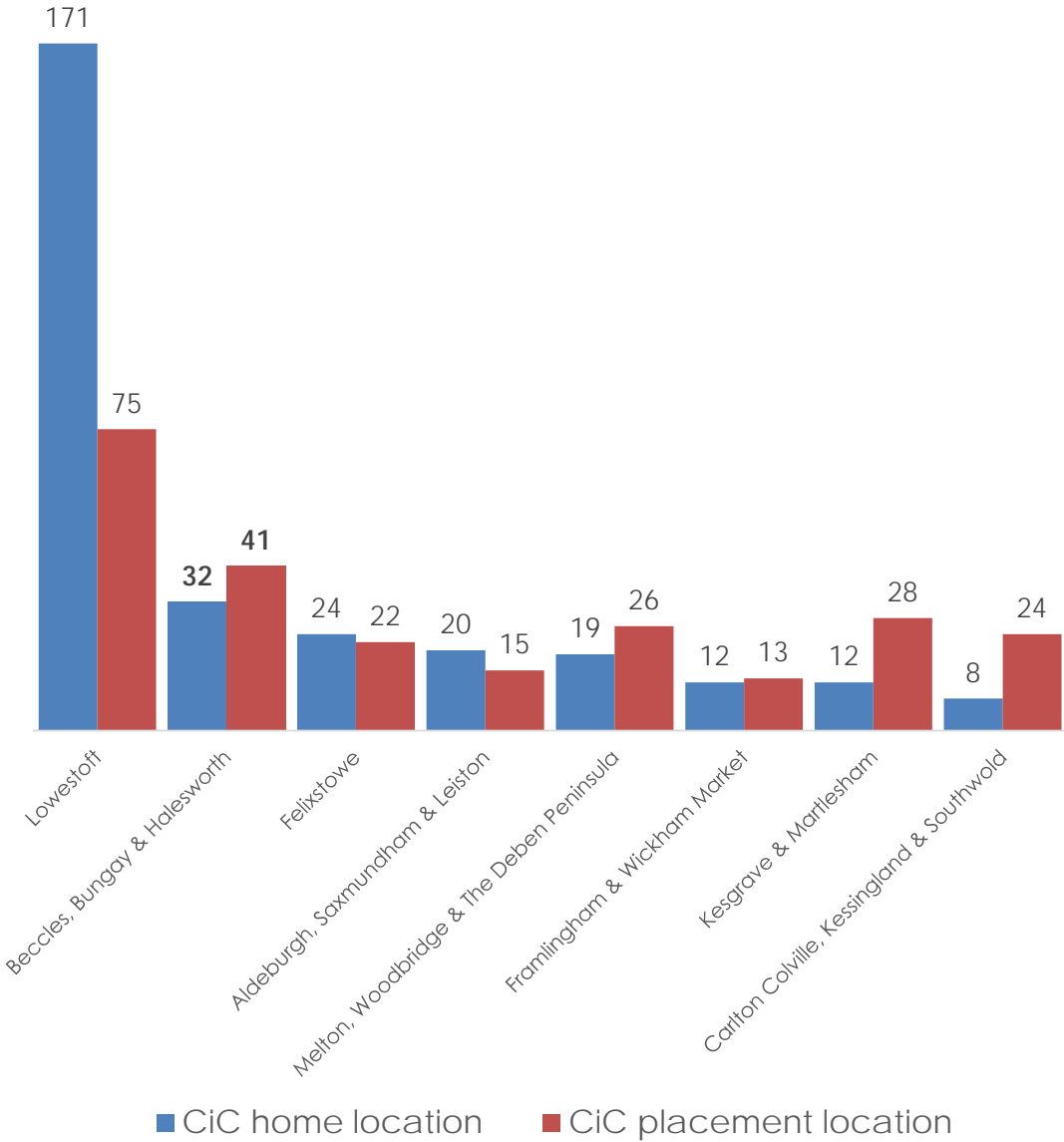

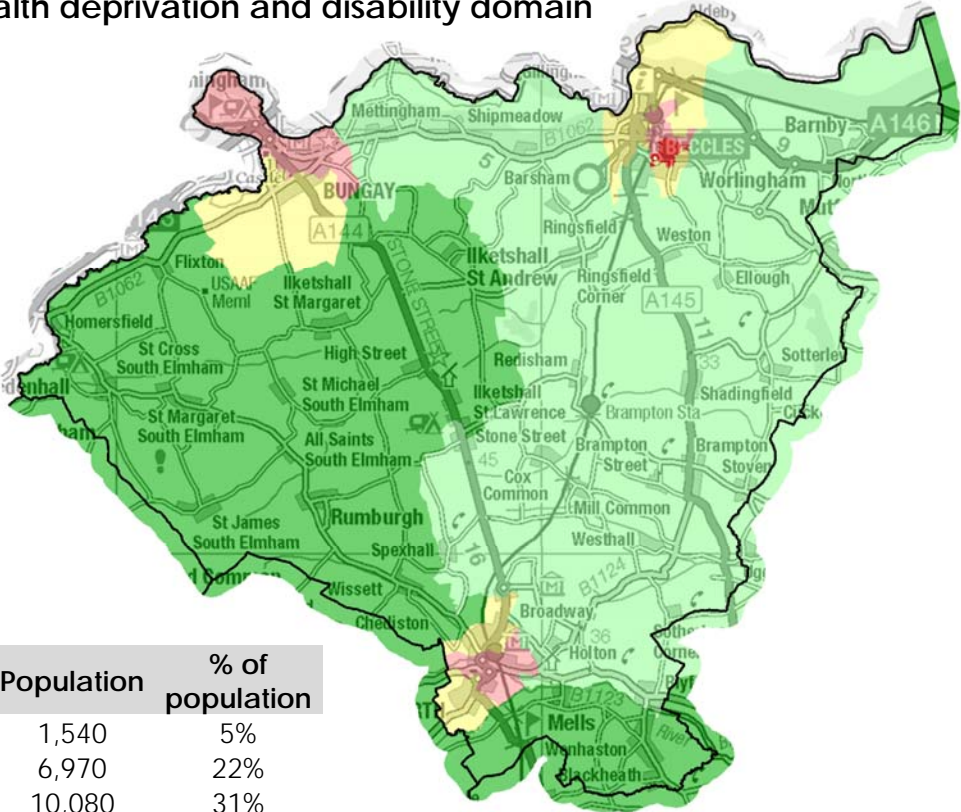

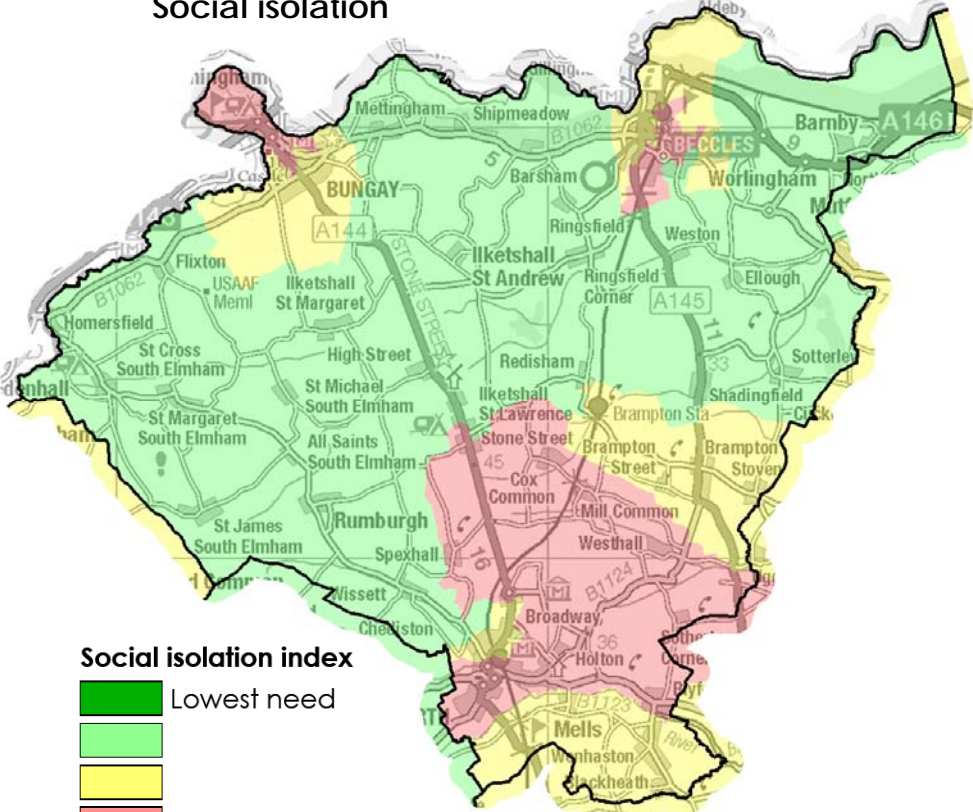

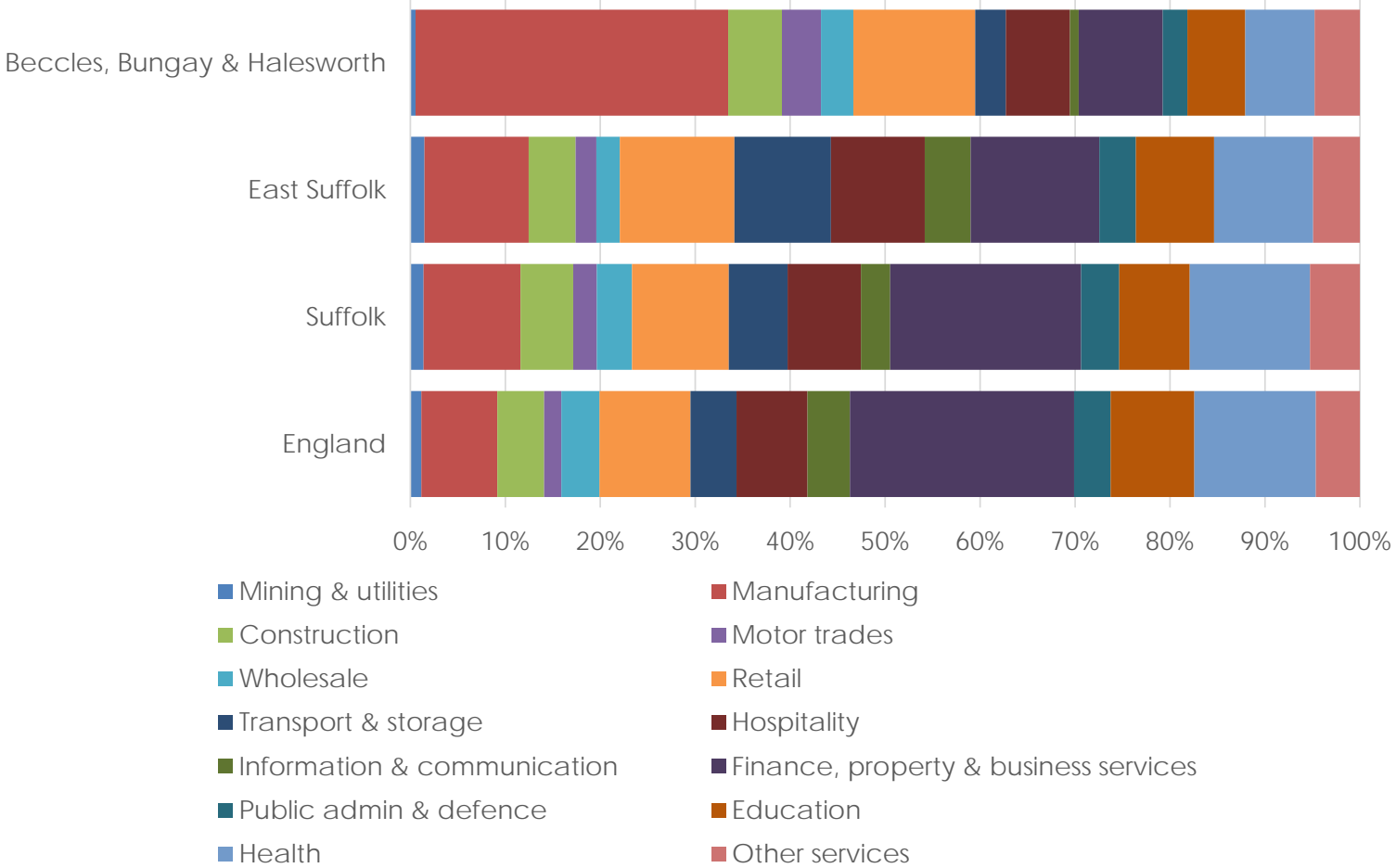

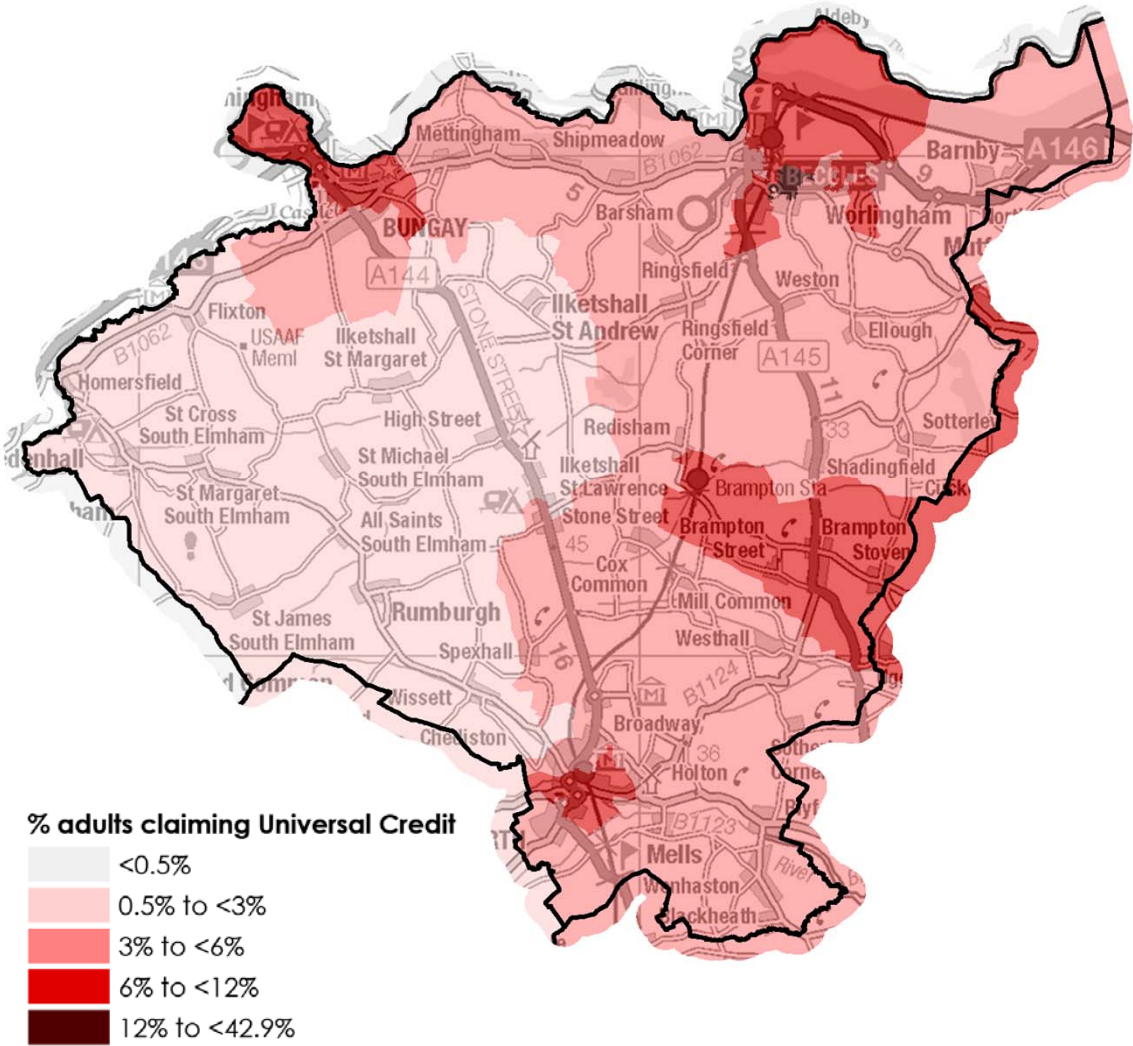

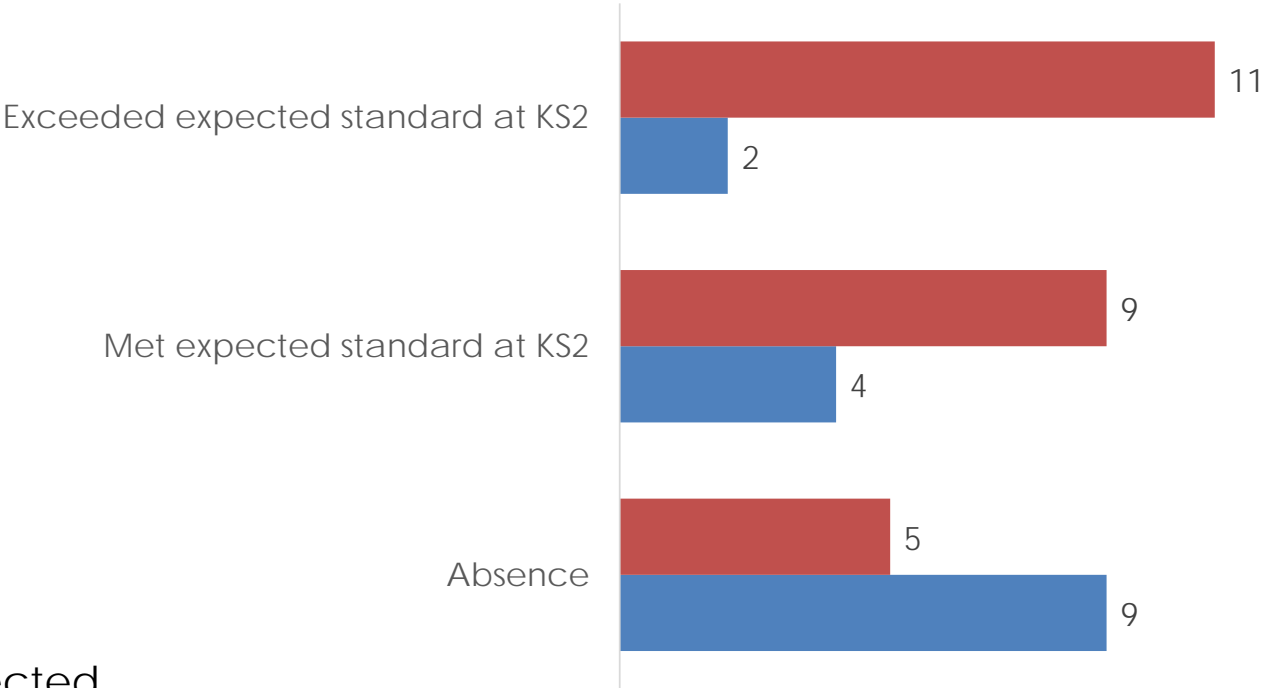

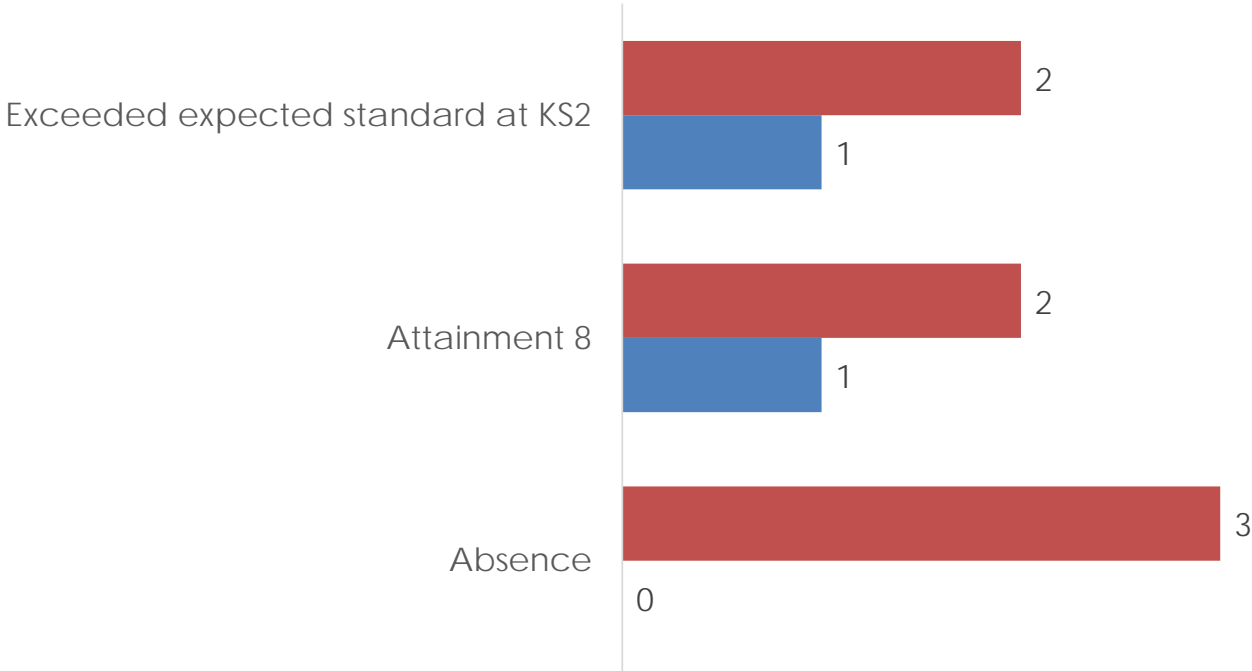

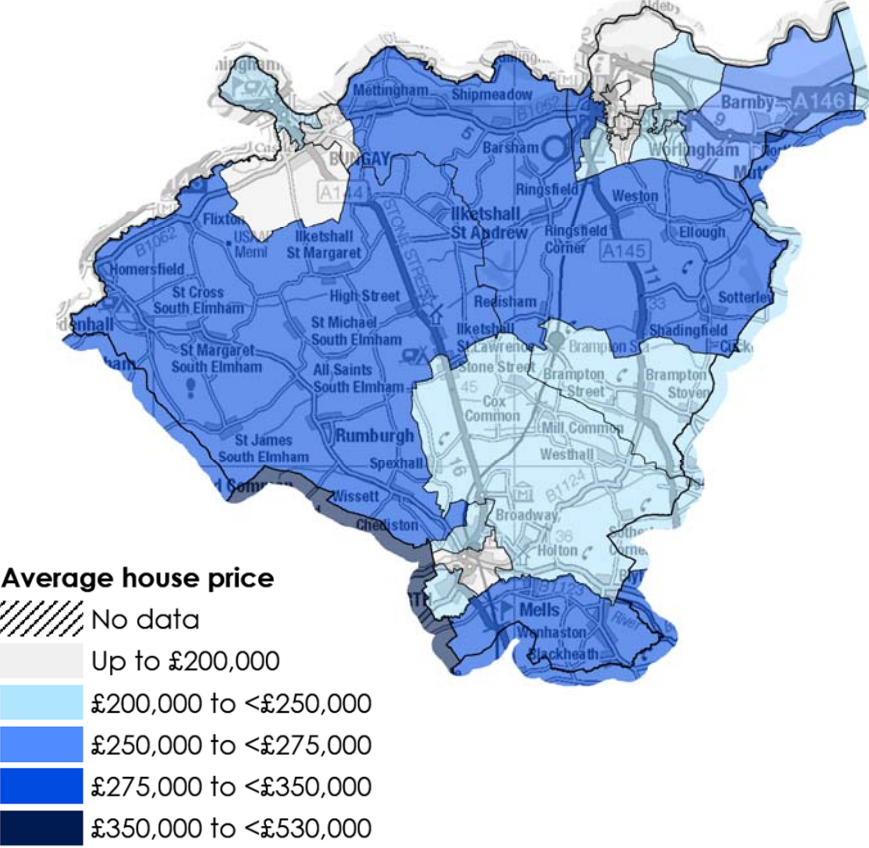

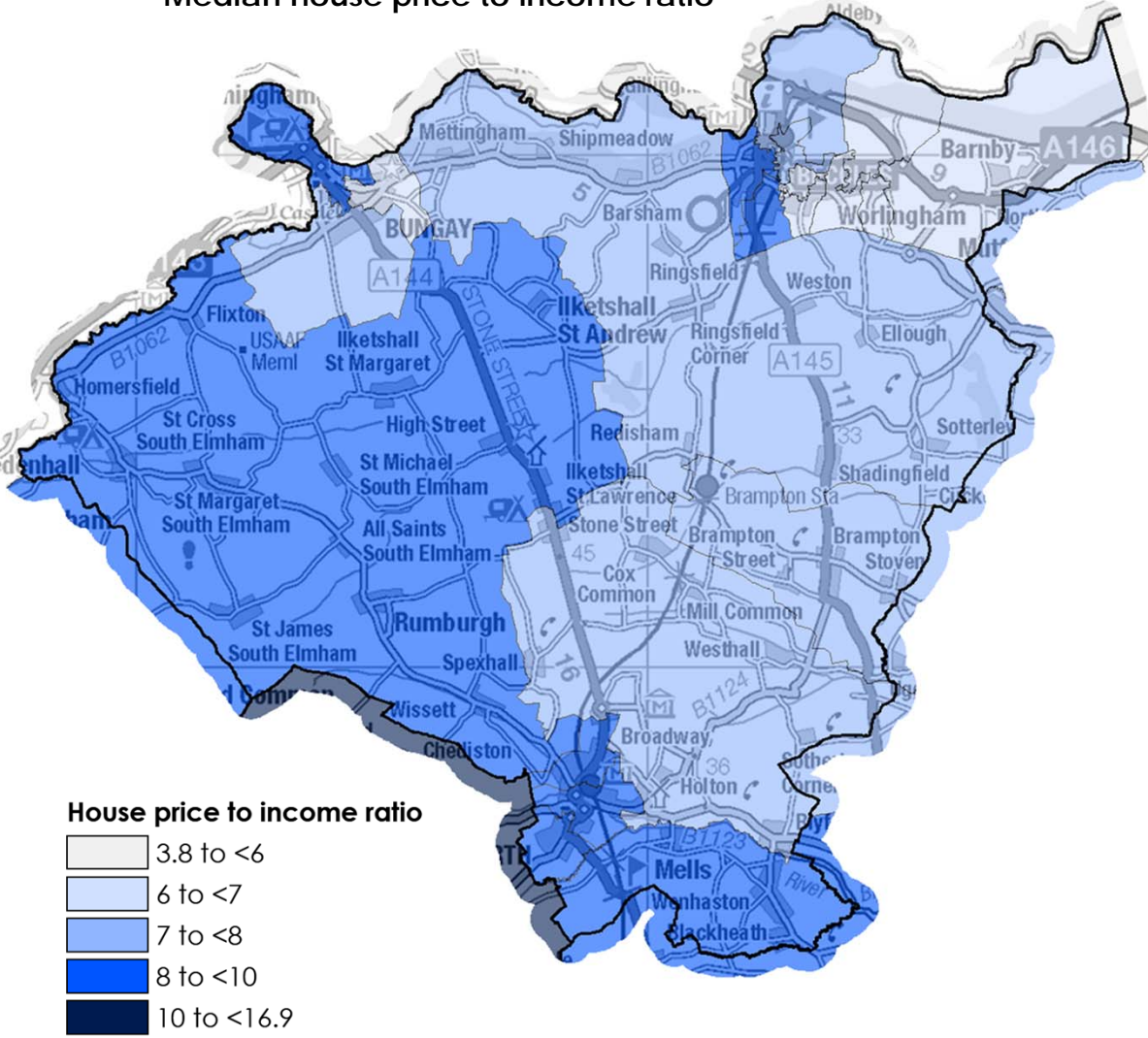

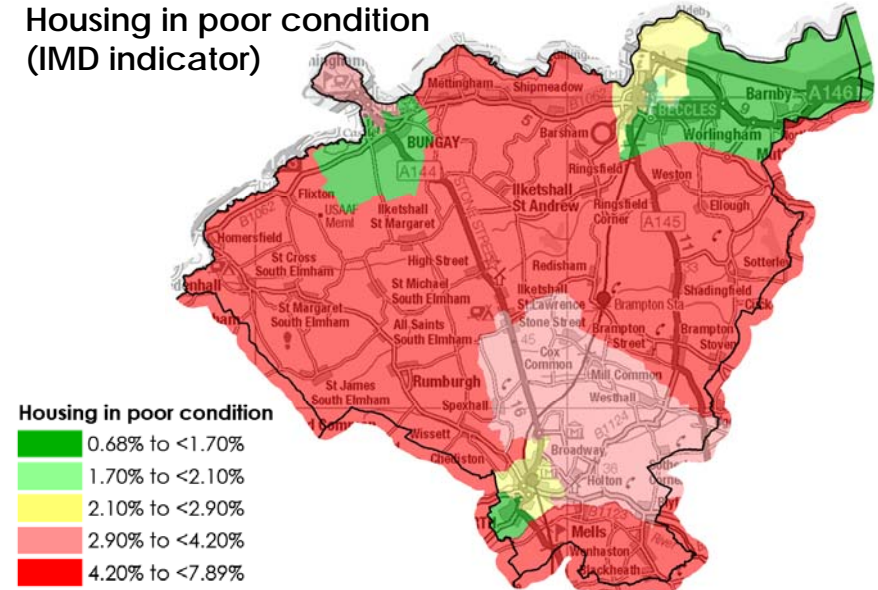

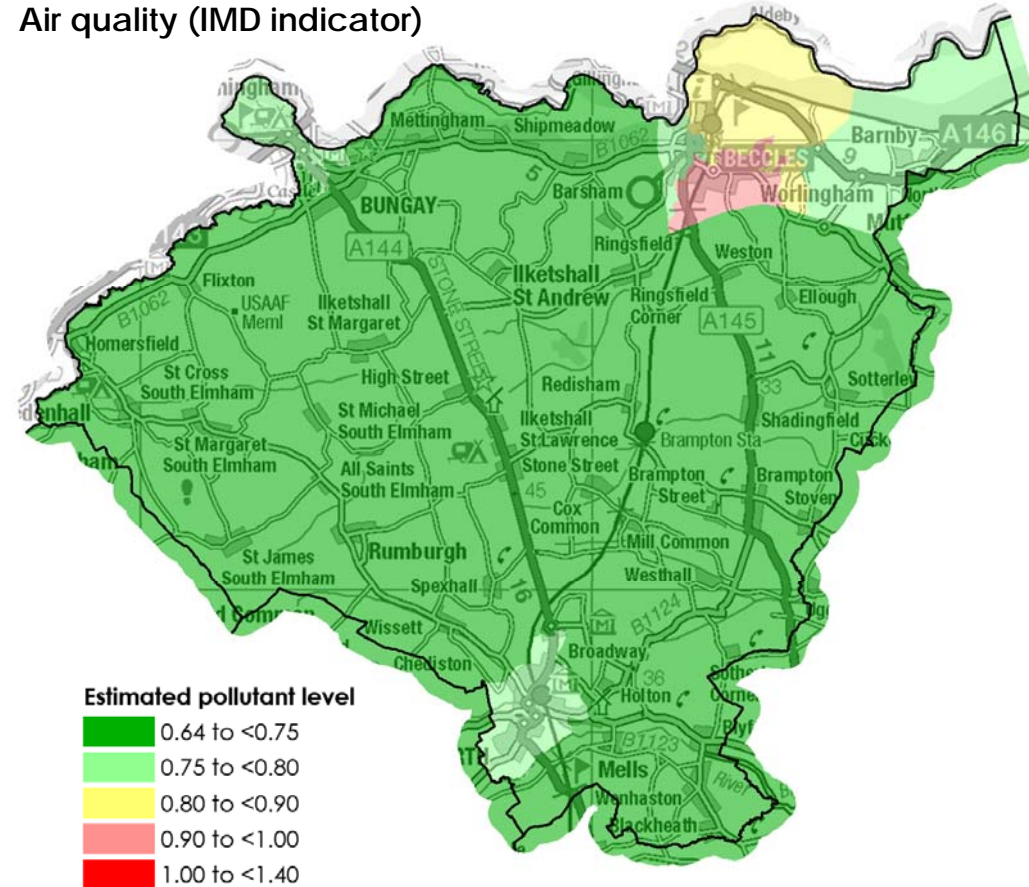

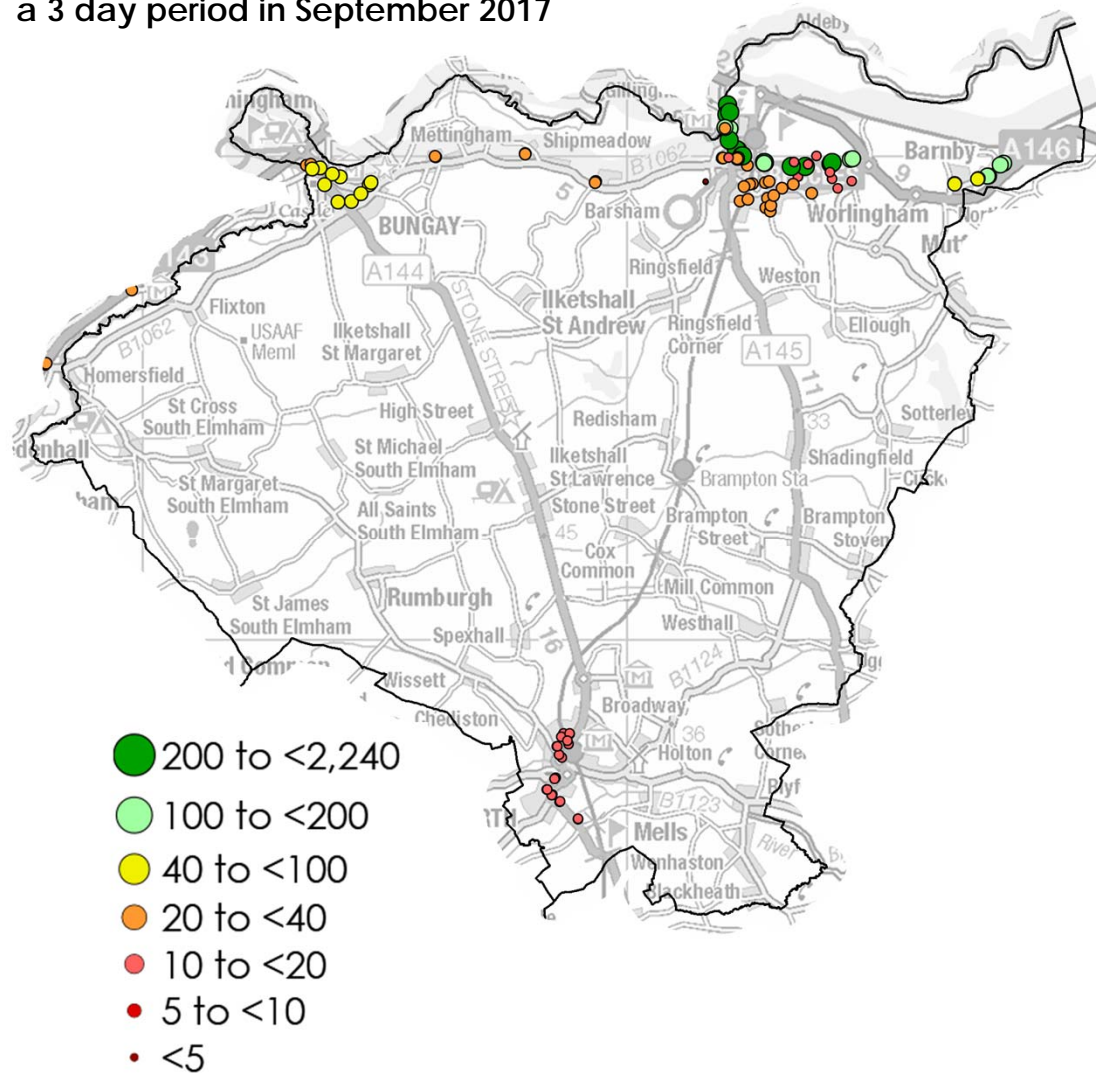
