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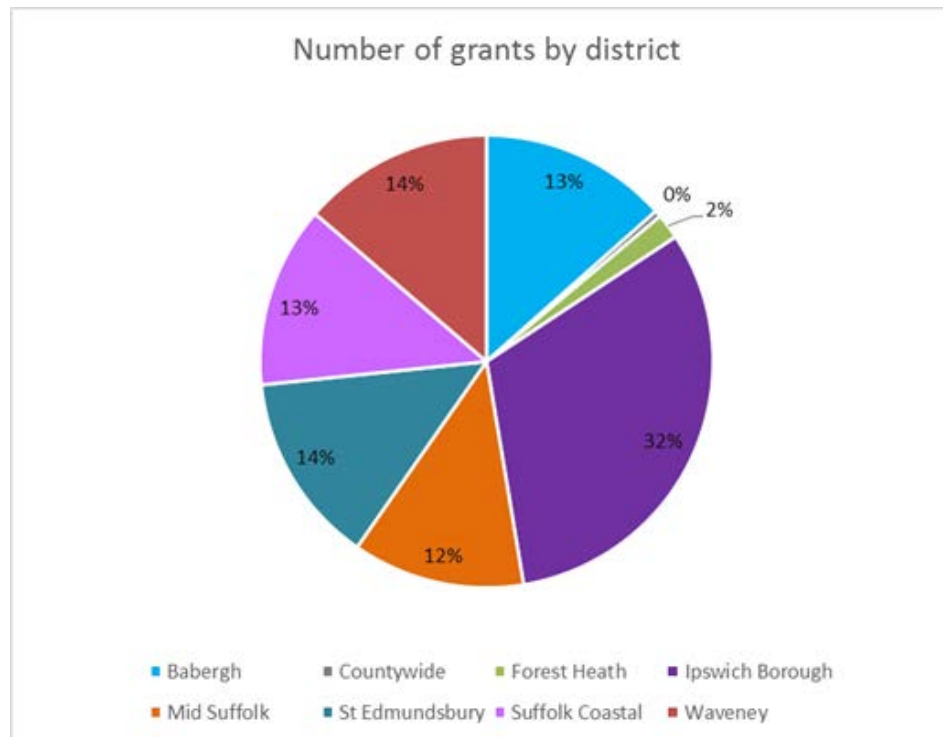

# Pargiter Fund

- ▶ Grants of up to £2,000
- ▶ Core and project costs
- ▶ At least 90% of the beneficiaries must be over the age of 65
- ▶ The fund supports projects addressing one or more of the following themes:
  - Improving health and well-being
  - Improving access to facilities, advice and training
  - Overcoming problems
- ▶ Outcomes expected Mid July

# Suffolk Sports Fund

- ▶ Grants of up to £2,000
- ▶ To provide opportunities that will increase participation in sports activity for those who struggle to access mainstream sports activities due to disability, isolation and disadvantage
- ▶ Core running costs will not be met out of this fund unless a clear increase in participation can be identified
- ▶ The fund is not open to national organisations

# Suffolk Rural Fund

- ▶ Grants of up to £4,000 are available to constituted organisations and up to £1,000 to smaller projects hosted by Parish Councils
- ▶ Core costs and project costs
- ▶ Aims to improve the quality of life for those who live and work in rural communities. Especially looking to support:
  - Outreach charitable work
  - Development of community hubs
  - Community self help

# Dementia Communities Fund

- ▶ Grants up to £5,000
- ▶ Delivering a greater awareness and understanding for those living with Dementia.
- ▶ Community based solutions.
- ▶ Available to groups with income under £500,000.

- ▶ Have a Development Director, Tim Holder who is always interested in showcasing information.

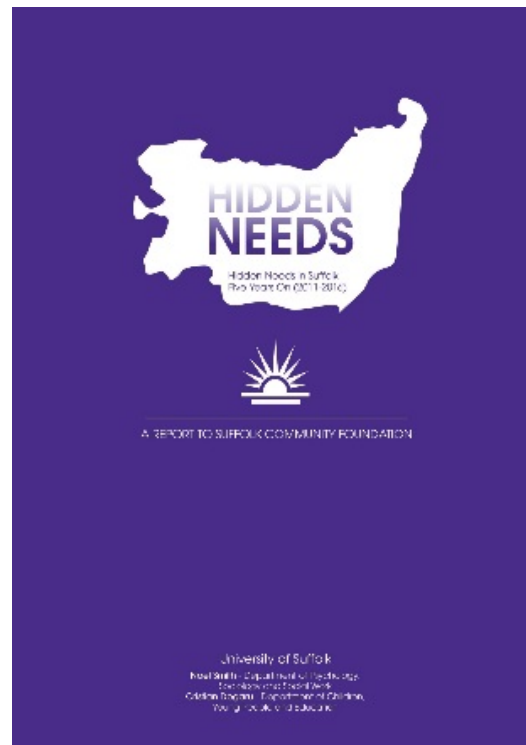
Intention is to create a film allowing “a glimpse through the window”.

- ▶ Office of National Statistics (NOMIS)
- ▶ ONS - National Migration
- ▶ Child Health Profile
- ▶ Social Mobility Index
- ▶ Educational attainment

# Key trends

- Over 83,000 people in Suffolk live in income deprivation at the most minimal standard by welfare benefits
- Deprivation goes beyond income and includes other forms of disadvantage
- There is a long term trend of increasing deprivation in Suffolk with 47% of neighbourhoods becoming more deprived since 2010



# Long Term Trends

- ▶ Overall deprivation is increasing
- ▶ Income deprivation is not improving and wages are low
- ▶ Growth is slowing down and the population is changing
- ▶ Life chances for the young can vary widely
