
East Suffolk Period Survey





A total of 1,184 people responded to the East Suffolk Period Survey. The survey was created by East Suffolk Council to gain a better understanding of the hidden impact periods can have on those who experience them.

We will use the information gathered to explore ways to provide the necessary support to reduce the stigma associated with the menstrual cycle.



104 respondents started their period before they turned 11 years old.



said they had not been educated about their menstrual cycle before it started.



said they had missed work or school due to their period with 707 respondents saying this was due to pain.

121 respondents said the Covid-19 pandemic and the resulting lockdowns impacted their access to sanitary products.



509 respondents have used sanitary items that were not fit for purpose, or for too long because of the cost. This includes leaving a tampon in for too long because they were worried about running out of them, or using rolled up toilet roll as a substitute.

89%

said they conceal sanitary items whilst going to the toilet in public.



2 in 10 respondents have been in receipt of free sanitary items. This includes help from a friend, food bank, school provision, or East Suffolk Period Poverty box.
