- 3. Attended Aldeburgh festival dressed as bike thieves to raise profile of campaign.

Key Lessons Learnt

Using a group's existing idea

The Idea to make a route map was already underway when the CEAF advisor started working with SSCC. The CEAF money and support allowed the group to progress plans and has enabled the publication of the map.

Networking with other CEAF communities

Through presence at events ideas Parham Pedal Pushers have been inspired to follow suit and try to link left of the A12 to the SSCC route network on the right of the A12.

Time and memory pressures

SSCC are organised and capable however holidays and illness will affect ability to deliver projects to a set timeframe and affects collective memory of tasks agreed to. This means support needs to explicit, written as well as verbal and followed up regularly.

There are still issues with land access, signage and traffic calming which the group hopes to tackle but SSCC have shown that with County support a network of suitable cycling routes could be set up.
