Work on track at Deben Leisure Centre

It's been a busy few months at Deben Leisure Centre in Woodbridge and we'd like to thank local people and businesses for their support so far through the development.

Work to reinvent the leisure facility is on schedule to be completed this summer, creating a modern and vibrant space for the whole community to enjoy.

Our Leisure Development Partners, Pulse Fitness who are carrying out the works, removed the old frontage to the building in just a week in September and the steel structure for the new reception area and fitness suite was quickly built in its place.

The focus was then on creating the new area to the back of the pool which will house the facility's new thermal suite featuring a steam, sauna and ice room.

Work to make the building watertight is expected to be completed at the end of this month and the focus will then be on the interior decoration and fitting out the new facility, ready for reopening in the summer.

Trees planted in community



Transition Woodbridge hope to plant new trees in the community

Five new trees are being planted in the community to replace the Canadian Maple lost at the new Deben Leisure Centre development, due to planning permission.

The community-led group, Transition Woodbridge have chosen to plant three apple varieties and two pear trees at Peterhouse Crescent on Saturday 27 January at 2pm (or Sunday 28 at 2pm if weather is poor).

The group are meeting at the Bullard's Lane end and children are welcome to attend.

Plans published for Leiston

Plans to improve Leiston Leisure Centre have now been published and we're asking for your feedback on the design and functionality of the building.

The enhanced facility will be given a new, first floor area, featuring a large gym with modern equipment, including cardiovascular, strength, resistance and functional zones.

Improvements will be made to the changing areas, providing high quality village wet changing facilities with family friendly parent and child cubicles, separate changing for schools and individual wet-side changing cubicles and showers.

A new health suite featuring a sauna, steam and ice room, a feature shower and relaxation area is being created, accessible from poolside.

The facility will also benefit from a new entrance space, with a coffee shop and an enhanced pool viewing area, including a soft play area for children.

The community will be able to access more fitness classes with two new dance studios and a

group cycling studio, which will also serve as multi-use bookable rooms.

Through listening to initial feedback and advice from Sport England, the two squash courts are being retained.

Improvements will also be made to the lighting in the pool area and the front car park will be resurfaced.

Work is planned to start in autumn, with an intial closure needed to undertake structural work for a short period.

The leisure centre will then partially open to give access to parts of the facility during the work.

The Leisure Team will be contacting a range of groups, leisure centre users and other key stakeholders in the next two months.
