Local Authority Role in the DCO Process

- The Secretary of State for Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy, Greg Clark MP will determine the application following a recommendation by the Planning Inspectorate (PINS).
- Suffolk Coastal District Council and Suffolk County Council are statutory consultees (host authorities).
- Our primary role is to evaluate, challenge and comment on the proposals.
- Our primary aim: to get the best possible outcomes for the people of Suffolk.











4 Key milestones: (we are still in pre-application phase)

- Stage 1 Consultation COMPLETE
 Joint response by SCDC and SCC issued (on website)
- 2. Stage 2 Consultation NOW

Was expected to provide greater detail on all aspects of the development, which it does not do in all areas: still some options, some areas of further development. Ends 3 February 2017.

3. Stage 3 Consultation – early 2018?

This is likely to be the draft Development Consent Order (DCO) complete with Preliminary Environmental Information. Quite technical.

4. Submission of DCO to the Planning Inspectorate – 2018/2019?





The Inspectorate, on behalf of the Secretary of State, has 28 days to decide whether the application meets the required standards to proceed to examination including whether the developer's consultation has been adequate.

You can send in your comments in writing. You can request to speak at a public hearing. The Inspectorate has 6 months to carry out the examination.

There is the opportunity for legal challenge.

Look out for information in local media and in public places near the location of the proposed project, such as your library. The developer will be developing their proposals and will consult widely.

You can now register as an interested party; you will be kept informed of progress and opportunities to put your case. Inspectors will hold a Preliminary Meeting and set the timetable for examination.

A recommendation to the relevant Secretary of State will be issued by the Inspectorate within 3 months. The Secretary of State then has a further 3 months to issue a decision on the proposal





What are we doing now?

- Full programme of engagement: SZC Task Group, Simultaneous Cabinet, DEFRA, Town and Parish Councils;
- Working towards a simultaneous Cabinet meeting of SCC and SCDC in January 2017 to determine a joint response;
- Input from now until finalisation of those reports is critical.
- By 3 February 2017 send EDF Energy and us your response please.






EDF Energy image, Stage 1 consultation – proposed SZC

EDF options that the Councils believe are unacceptable:

Option 1 – do nothing

Option 2 - bend widening



Option 3: Farnham bypass



2 village bypass: Councils think that Option 4 is the minimum mitigation required but ...




TRANSPORT PROPOSALS – A12, Farnham

- Councils' preferred outcome is full four village bypass (Farnham, Stratford, Little Glemham, Marlesford)
- EDF says this can't be justified based on impacts from Sizewell alone
- We are seeking Government funding for the whole scheme
- If successful, we would ask EDF to contribute what they would otherwise have spent on Farnham to help fund this project
- So far, the Government has given us £1m to develop a business case. But no guarantee that this will lead to full funding
