Title of Report	East Suffolk Commercial Investment Strategy
Report Reference	REP1675

Purpose of Report

To approve the proposed East Suffolk Commercial Investment Strategy for both Suffolk Coastal and Waveney District Councils. The strategy explained the objectives and proposed approach for trading commercially, including investment in property, which would play a key part in delivering the objective of Financial Self Sufficiency.

Options Considered

The option of undertaking direct investment by the Councils themselves has been considered, however it was concluded that the outline proposal of developing a company structure had a range of advantages, including greater flexibility for undertaking commercial activity generally.

Reason for Decision

The East Suffolk Commercial Investment Strategy would help the Councils to deliver the East Suffolk Business Plan objective of Financial Self Sufficiency.

- 2. That officers be instructed to take further legal and financial advice in order to set up an arm length trading Company for future investment and trading purposes.

Title of Report	Discretionary Business Rates Relief Scheme
Report Reference	REP1671

Purpose of Report

To approve the discretionary rate relief schemes to help those businesses most affected by the revaluation of Non-Domestic Rates premises on 1 April 2017.

Options Considered

None. The Government are providing funding and expect Local Authorities to design their own schemes.

Reason for Decision

Both proposed schemes have been designed so that the recipients of this discretionary award will be local businesses facing the steepest increases in their business rates bills, as a result of the 2017 Business Rates Revaluation.

Restricting relief to local businesses means that both Councils can afford to provide more generous schemes of relief than that indicated by the Government's allocation criteria. This should also mean that there is residual funding available to assist more businesses on a case by case basis, through the establishment of Hardship Funds for both authorities.

As the amount of funding reduces each year, the Section 151 Officer will be able to adjust the amount of relief according to the funding available.

SIMULTANEOUS CABINET DECISION:

Suffolk Coastal District Council Cabinet:

- 1) Approved the Discretionary Business Rates Relief Scheme Guidelines set out in Appendix A, limiting the rates bill increase for eligible businesses in 2017/18 to 10%.
- 2) Approved that any residual Government funding remaining after operation of the scheme in accordance with the Guidelines is utilised to establish a Hardship Fund to provide support to businesses on a case by case basis.
- 3) Delegated authority to the Section 151 Officer, acting in conjunction with the Leader, to determine the Rateable value cap and maximum percentage increase for each subsequent year of the scheme.

Waveney District Council Cabinet:

- 4) Approved the Discretionary Business Rates Relief Scheme Guidelines set out in Appendix A, limiting the rates bill increase for eligible businesses in 2017/18 to 9%.
- 5) Approved that any residual Government funding remaining after operation of the scheme in accordance with the Guidelines is utilised to establish a Hardship Fund to provide support to businesses on a case by case basis.
- 6) Delegated authority to the Section 151 Officer, acting in conjunction with the Leader, to determine the Rateable value cap and maximum percentage increase for each subsequent year of the scheme.

Purpose of Report

To approve the East Suffolk Tourism Strategy, which sets out a proposed approach to developing and growing the tourism sector based on the Councils existing strengths, which include the high quality natural and built environment which exists within the districts and addressing the weaknesses within the sector including low productivity. The East Suffolk Tourism Strategy was also supported by an associated delivery plan.

Options Considered

Not to develop a Tourism Strategy. This was rejected as it would not be in the best interests of the Councils and would not contribute towards the objectives within the economic growth plan and the East Suffolk Business Plan.

Reason for Decision

The East Suffolk Tourism Strategy and Delivery Plan would ensure that the Councils have an effective approach to enhancing and growing the East Suffolk visitor economy. The East Suffolk Tourism Strategy and associated Delivery Plan would also greatly support the delivery of the Councils economic growth and Business Plan objectives.

That the East Suffolk Tourism Strategy and Delivery Plan be approved and that Delegated Authority be granted to the Head of Economic Development and Regeneration, in consultation with the Suffolk Coastal District Council Deputy Leader & Cabinet Member for Economic Development and with the Waveney District Council Cabinet Member for Tourism & Economic Development, to make minor amendments to the Strategy and Delivery Plan.
- 2. That the establishment of a Tourism Steering Group to oversee the delivery of the Tourism Strategy and Delivery Plan be approved.
