6 MAJOR PROJECTS FUNDED IN 2021/2022

Equipment for Kessingland Men's Shed

Enabling the team to tackle social isolation and loneliness, improve mental and physical wellbeing, and equip members with new skills.

Equipment for KessinglandCommunity and Kitchen Garden

Creating a community space where people can come together, learn new skills, share food resources and be outdoors.

Creating an outdoor education and recreation area for school and community use.

SMALL GRANTS, BIG IMPACT

11 grants awarded with a total of £13,056.

Grants are awarded across the CP area and benefit a wide demographic



- Activities for adults with additional needs.
- Enhancing facilities in rural communities.
- Improvement of park/green spaces
- Environmental/nature engagement.
- Enhancing community group facilities to allow for expanded reach.







COST OF LIVING SUPPORT IN YOUR COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIP AREA

- Grants for all our primary schools to fund uniform and shoes for families in need.
- The purchase of 40 slow cookers, microwaves, air fryers or table top hobs for residents in difficulty.
- The development of a local professionals resource, setting out a comprehensive list of cost of living support for residents.
- 4 Cost of Living Roadshows in the CP area
- 3 Warm Room venues with many others offering 2-3 hour sessions.

WHAT NOW; PLANS FOR 2023

A WHOLE CHILDHOOD EMOTIONAL WELLBEING PROJECT

Baby to Preschool

Training and equipping community settings to support families with emotional and social development and to identify issues at an early stage. This includes preschools, nurseries, baby and toddler groups.

Primary Mental Health

To equip schools to develop emotional wellbeing and resilience to challenges. This includes whole school programmes, training in trauma and resources.

Secondary Mental Health

To expand professional counselling provision in one of our secondary schools to allow more students to access timely support.
