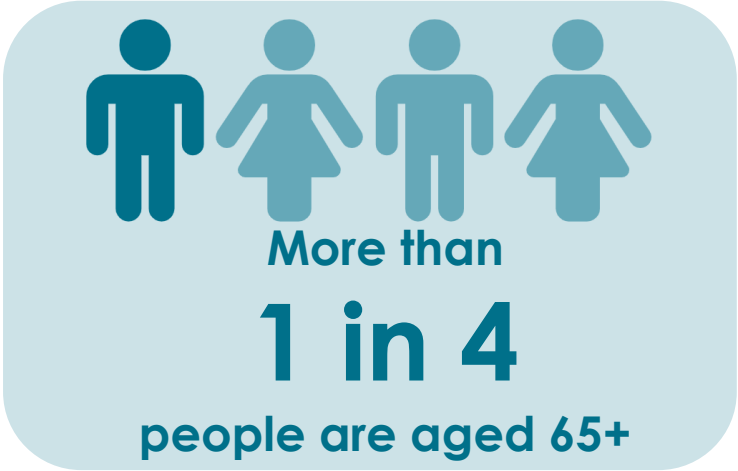

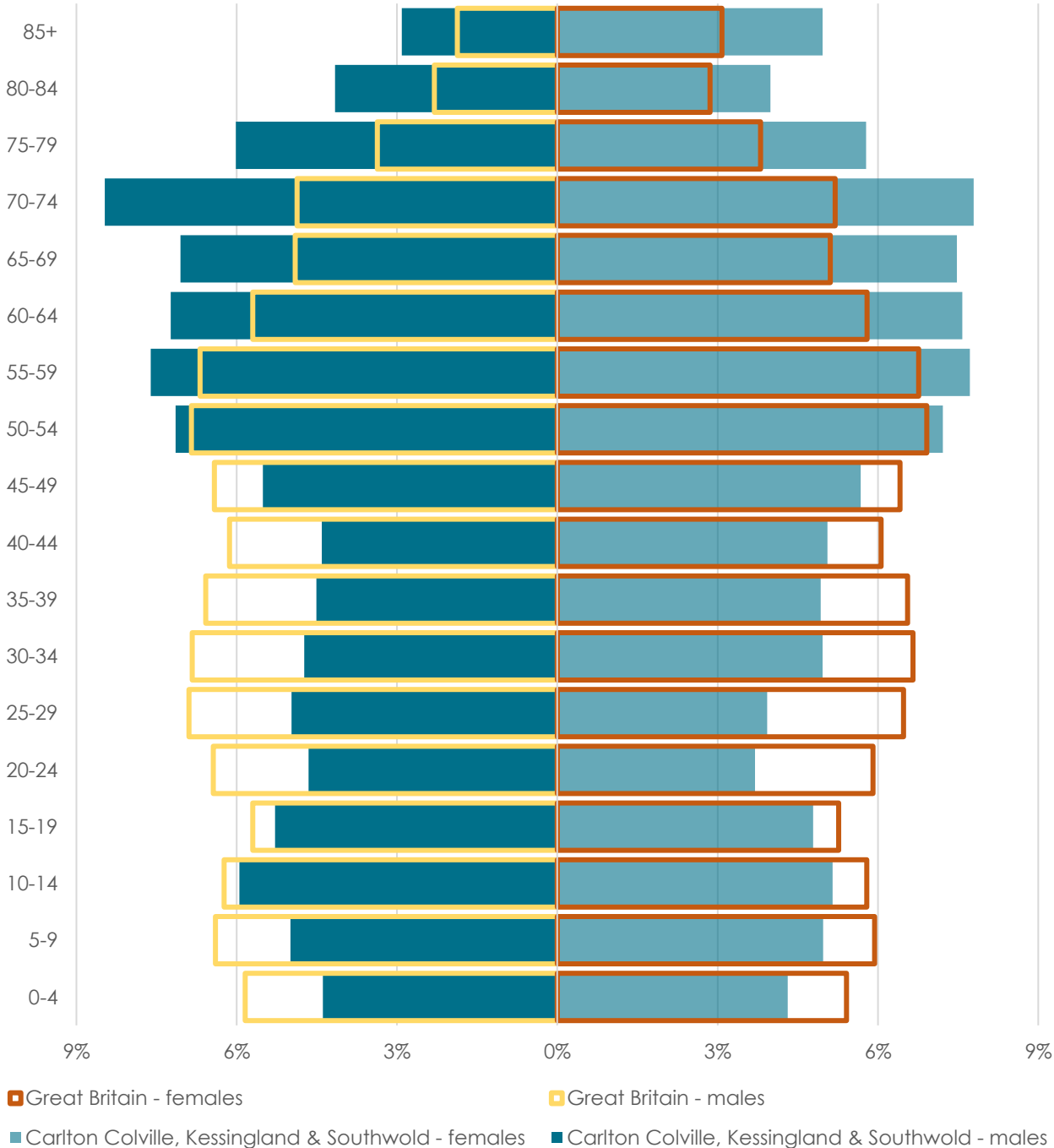
# Population Age breakdown

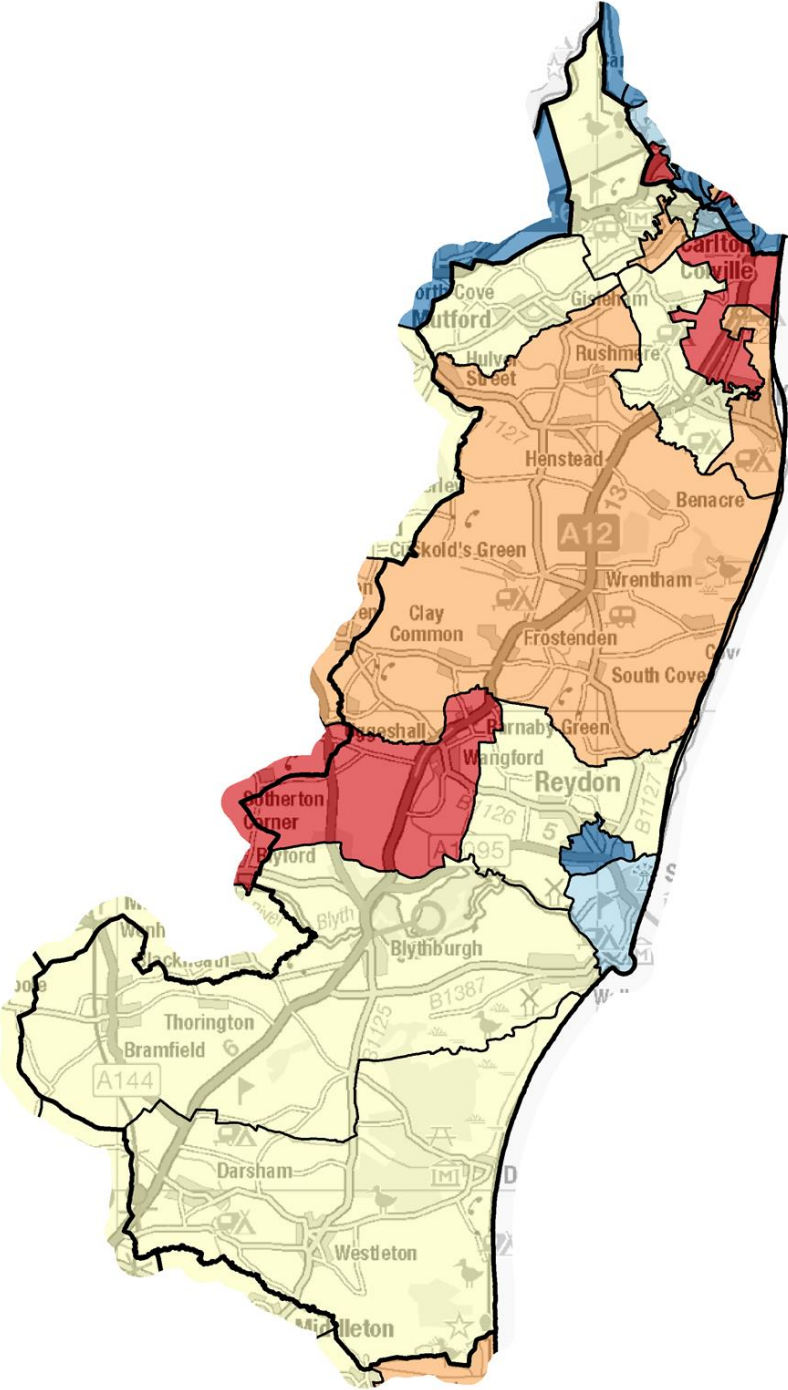

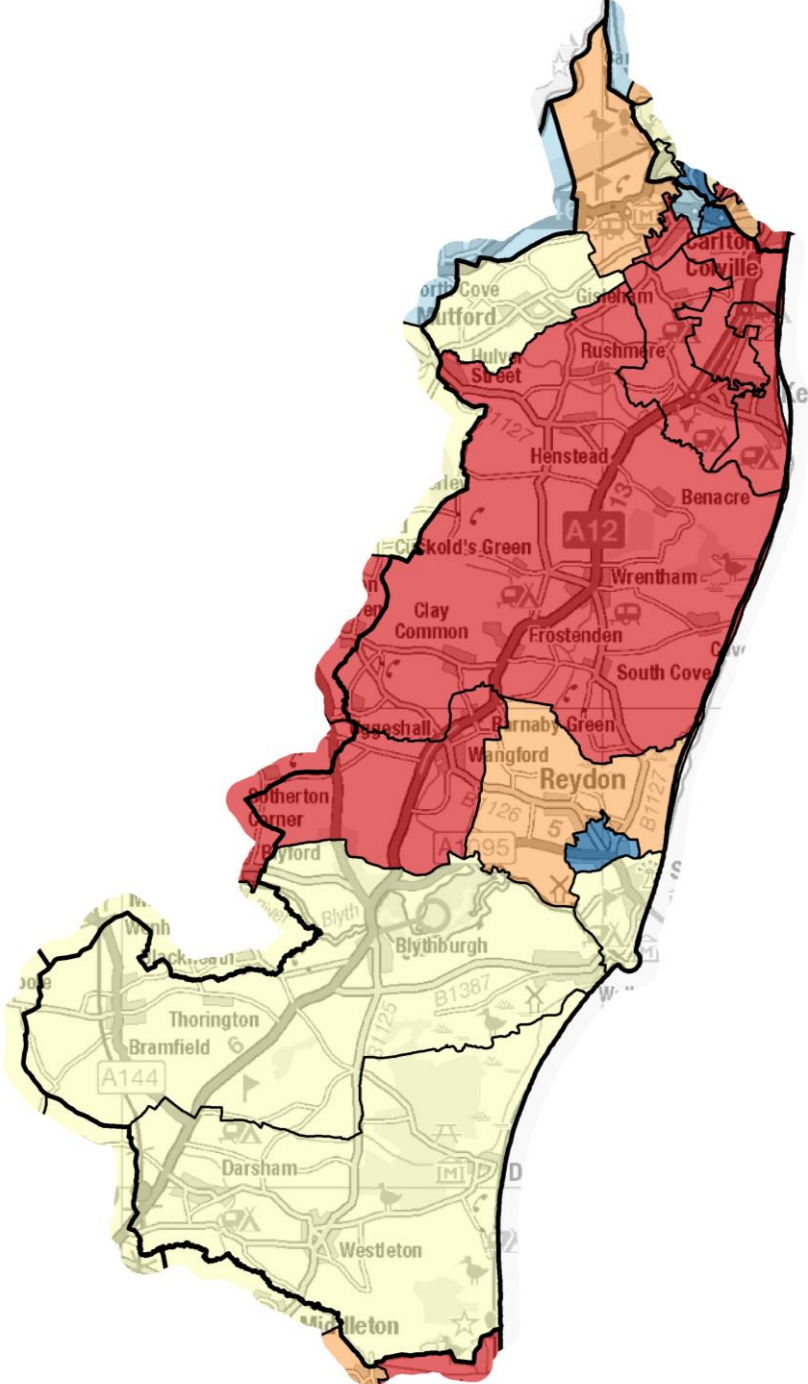
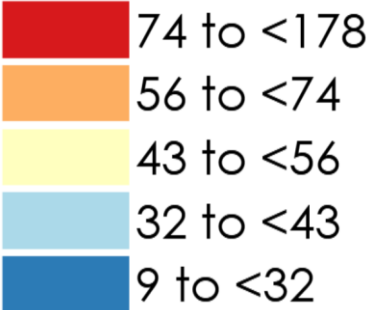
## Children aged 0-15 income deprived

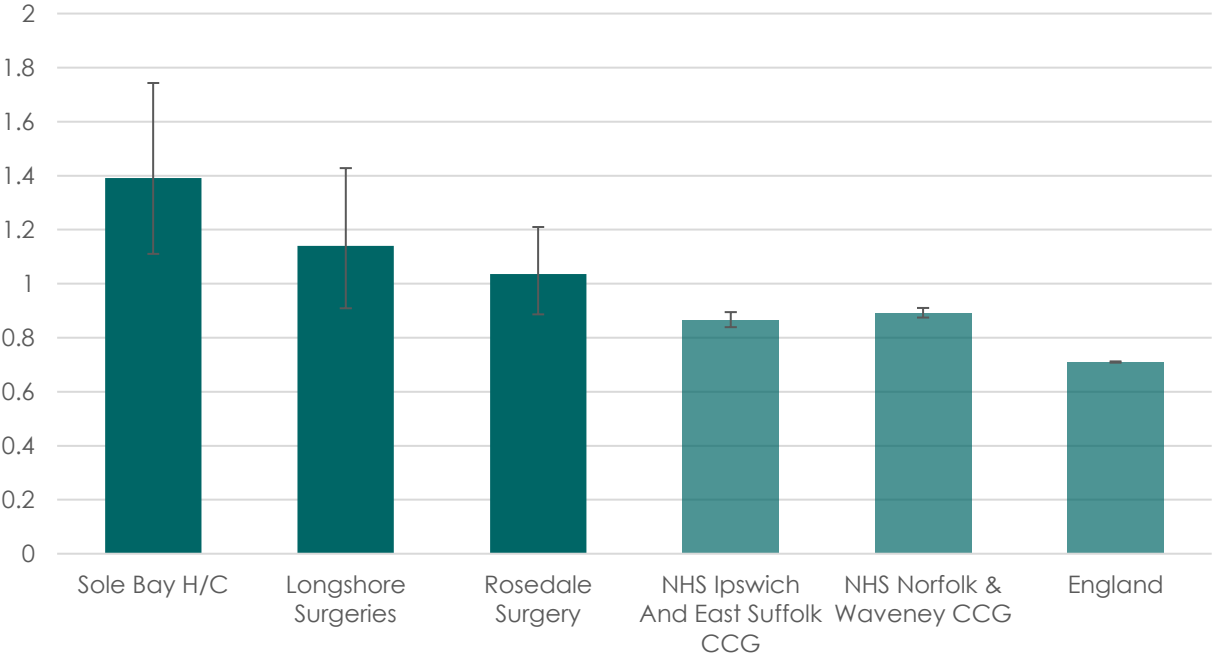

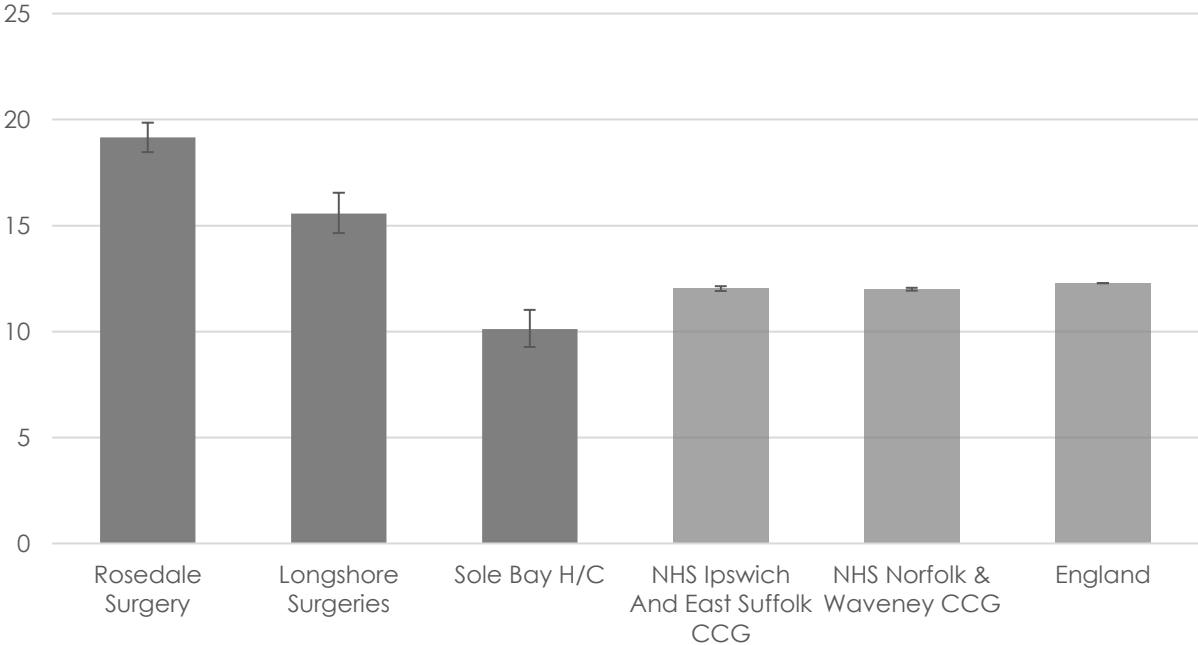
## Mental health

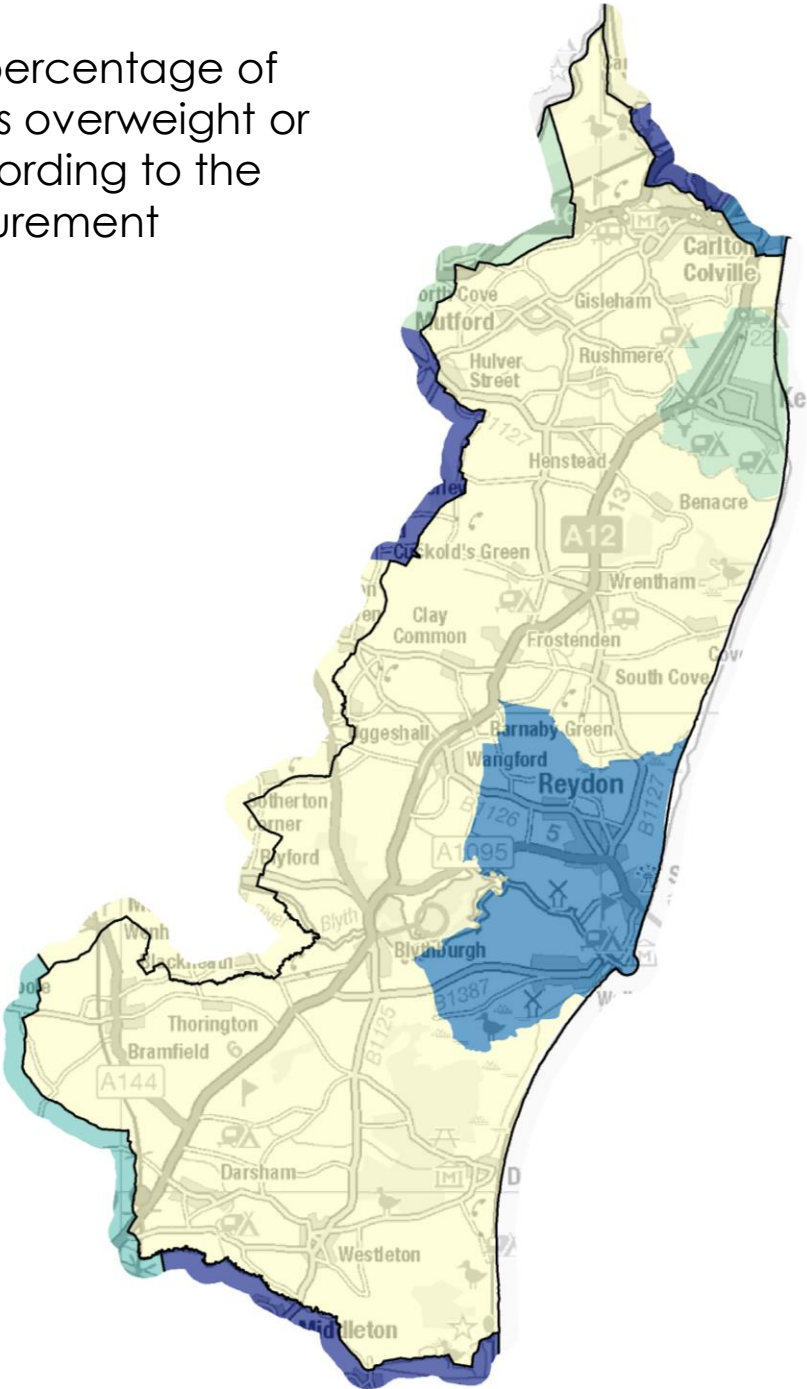
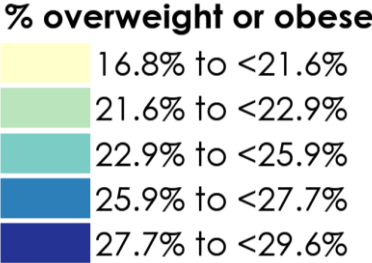

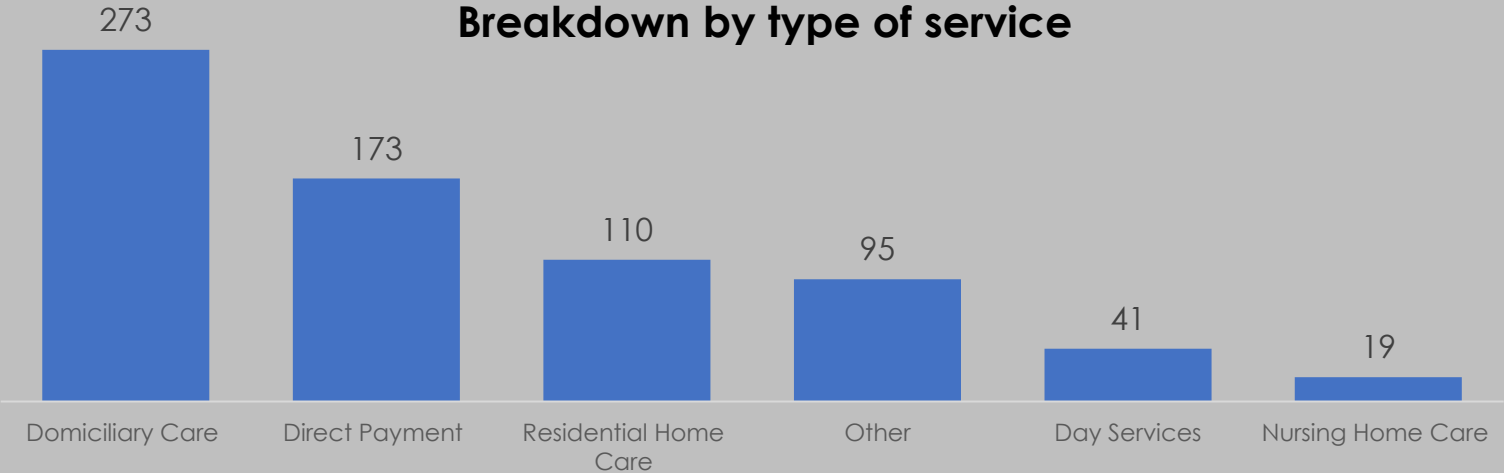

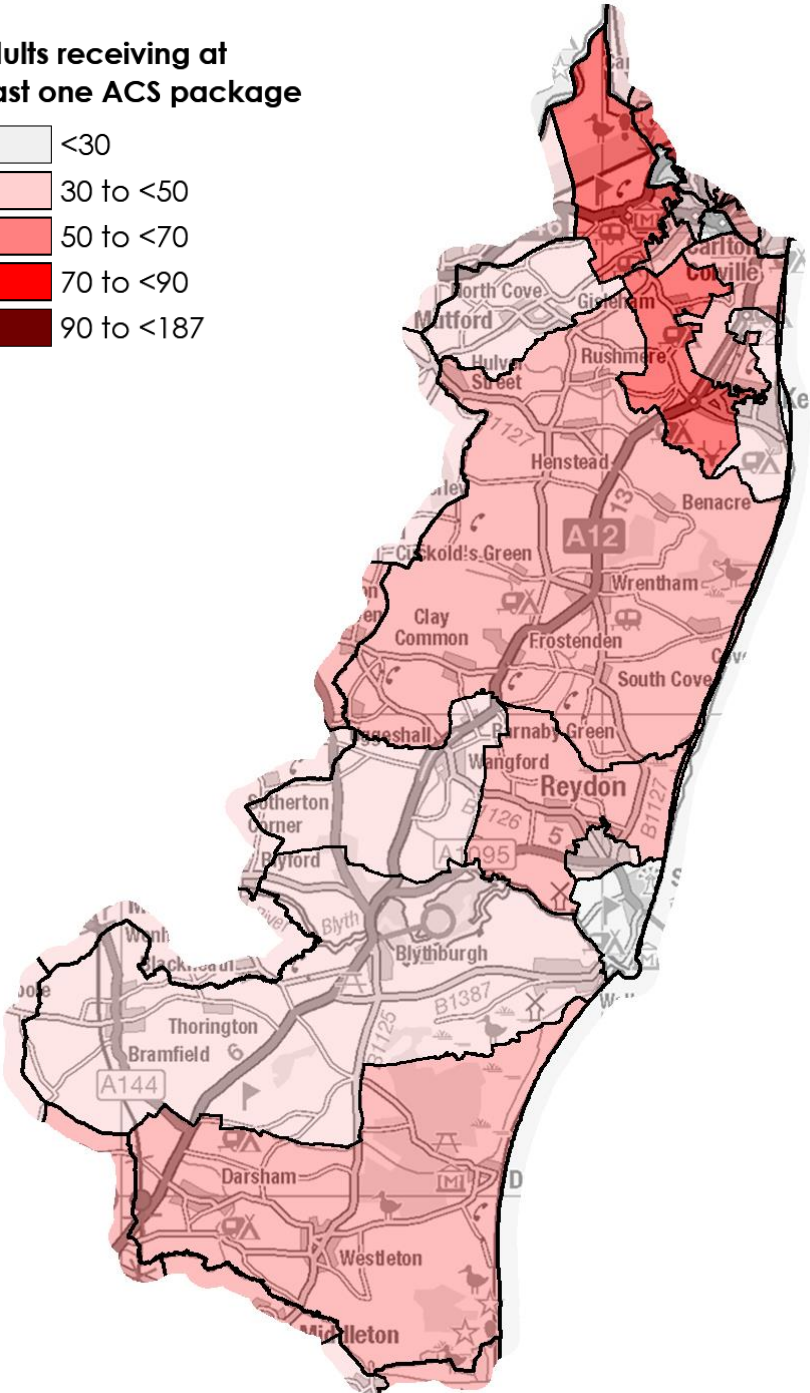
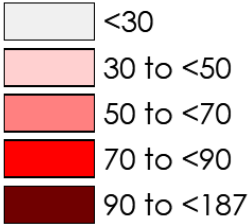

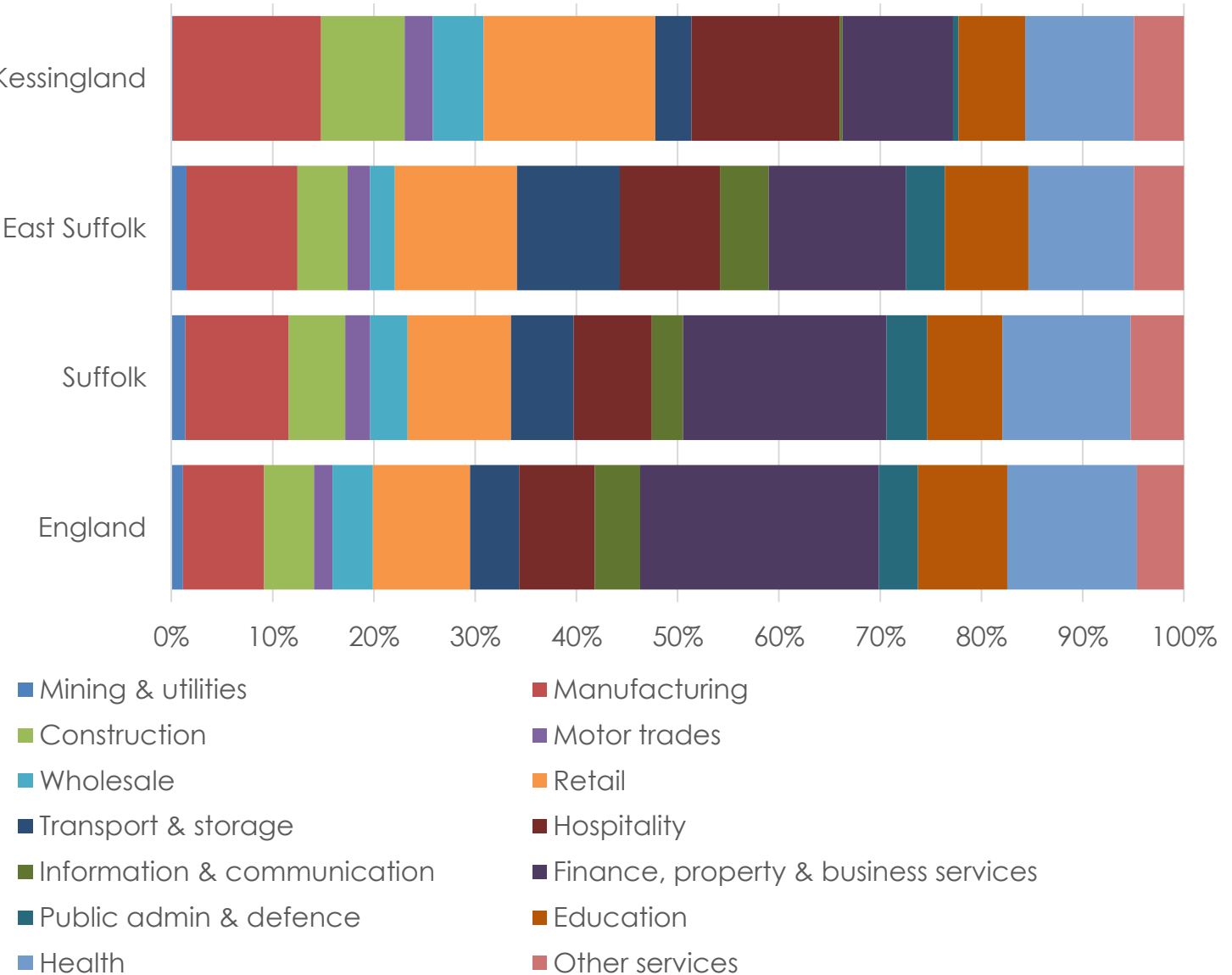

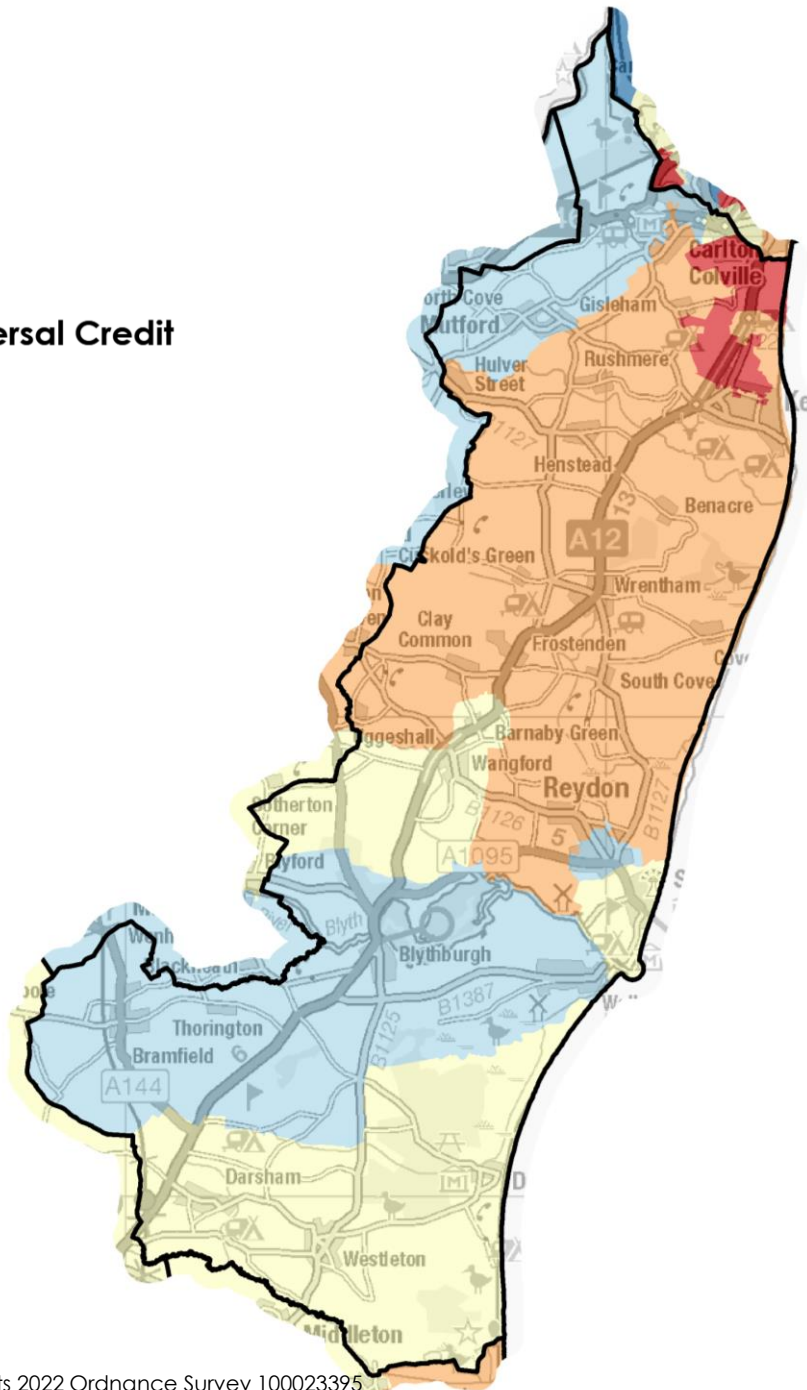

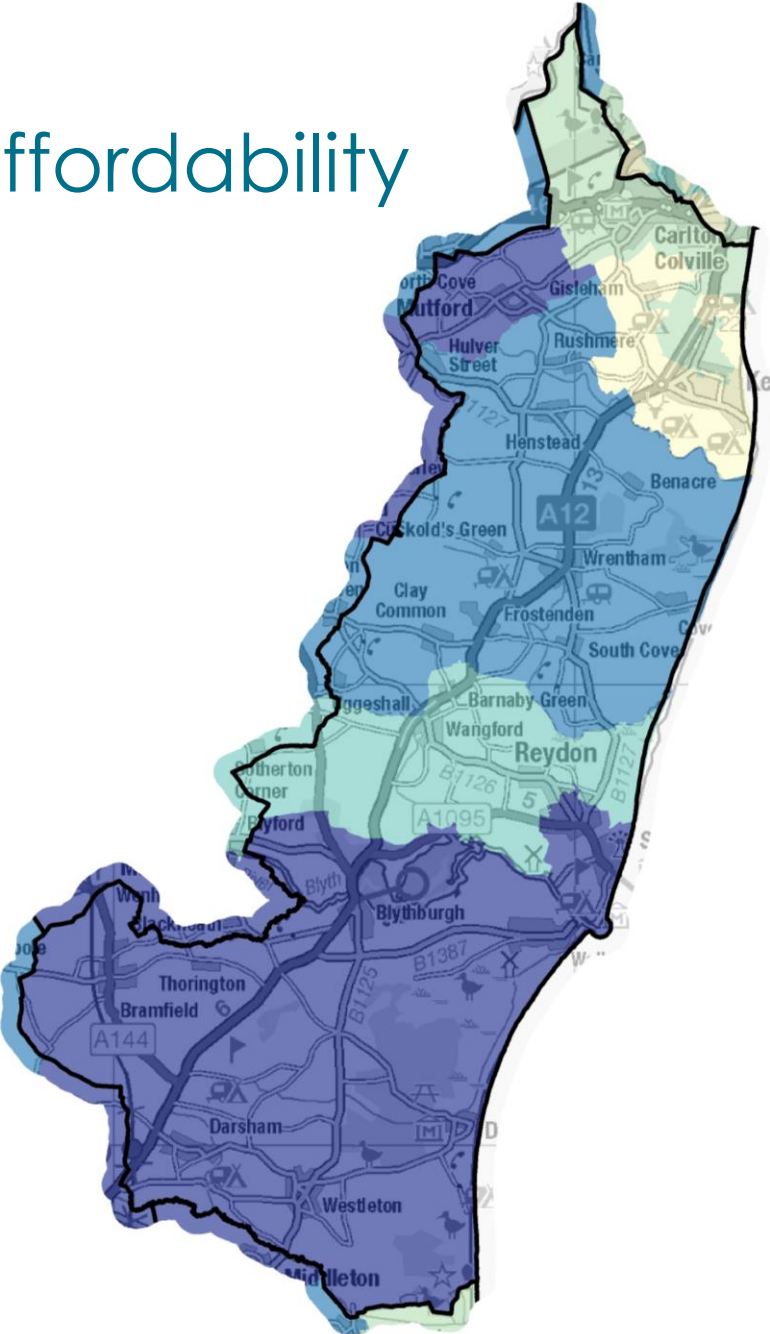

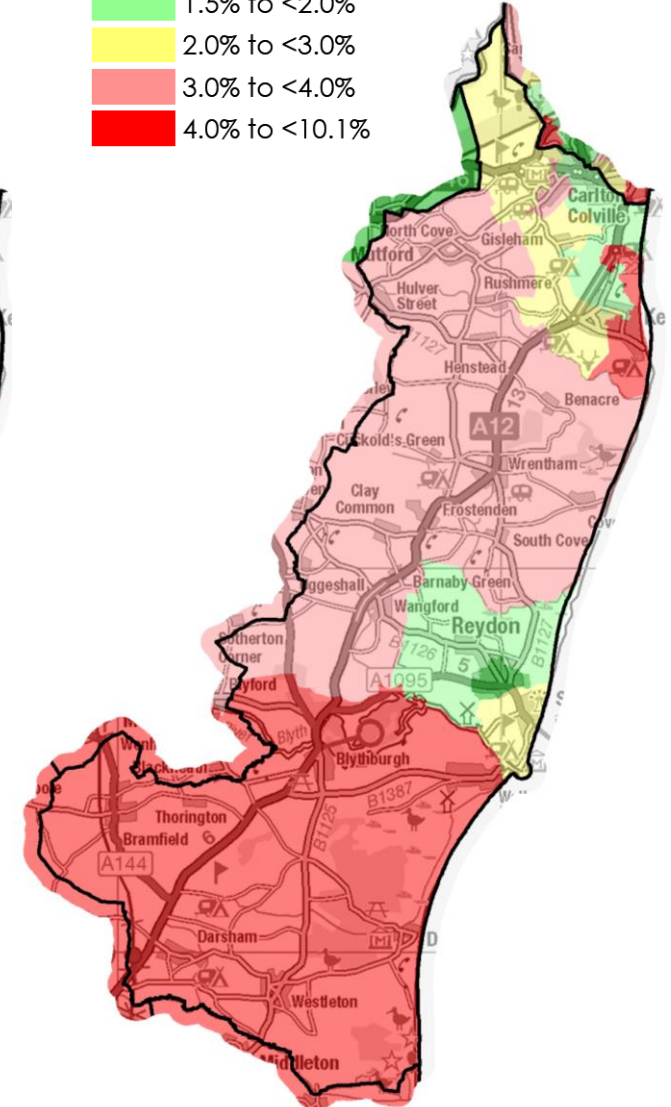

Data is based on regular services only so if a service runs e.g. on one or two days a week it is not included

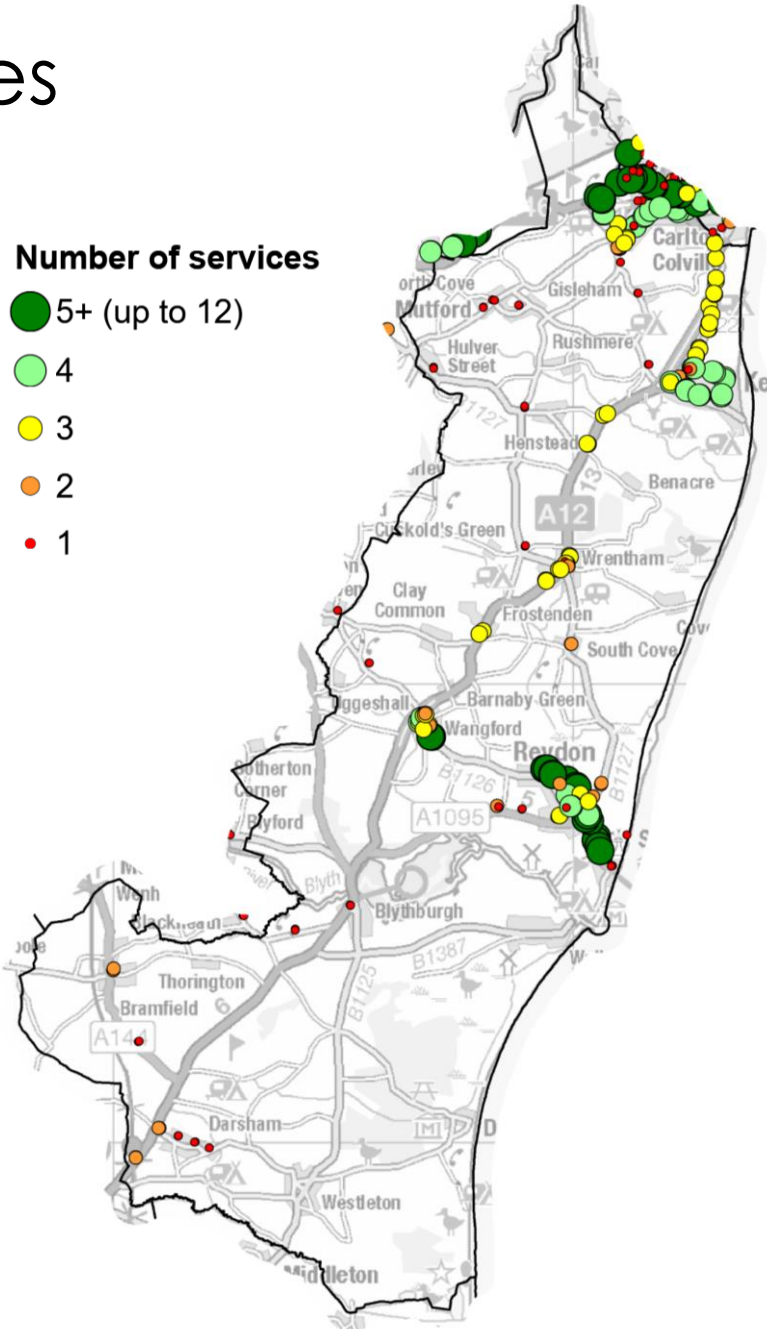

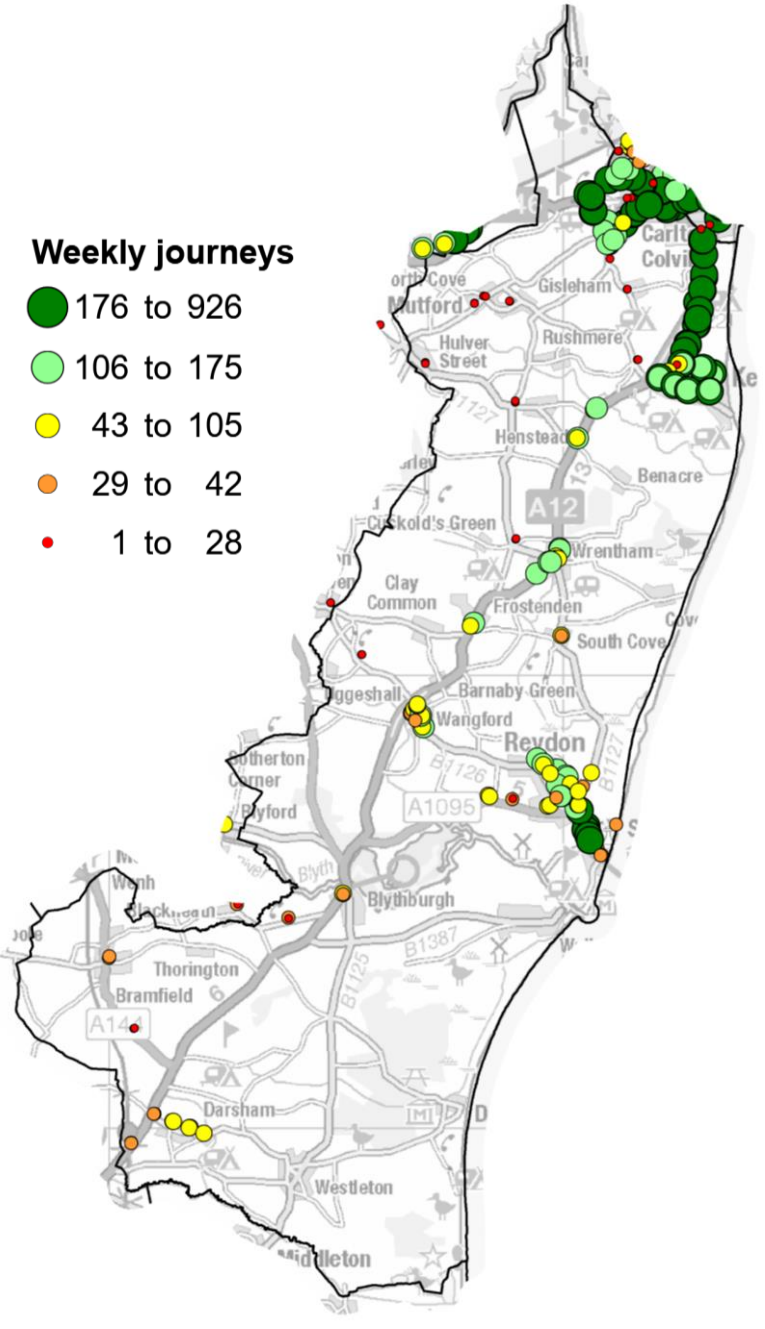
