




Population Age breakdown














Prevalence of dementia is higher than the national average among patients at both GP surgeries in the Framlingham, Wickham Market and villages Community Partnership area


Depression: Recorded prevalence (aged 18+)




Prevalence of depression is lower than the national average among patients at both GP surgeries in Framlingham, Wickham Market and villages Community Partnership area









Employment and education Benefit claimants







Employment and education Education – Key Stage 2






