

Funding Update

As you will know, the funding process for Community Partnerships (CPs) is live, with budget allocations provided by each CP for 2019/20 projects, with outcome proposals being submitted / in development.

This is a new way of working, which is purposefully non-bureaucratic. The aim is to allow CP's the freedom and flexibility to commission projects and activity against agreed objectives / priorities. However, from learning already to date, this does set the challenge for the Chair / Partnership to ensure that processes and decisions about budget spend are both inclusive and transparent.

Lessons Learnt:

Be mindful of procurement thresholds. Any spend over £5,000 will require some form of procurement, whether that be quotations for work or a tender process. Officers can help to ensure the correct processes are followed in terms of commissioning work.

Projects / activity requesting CP budget need to be shared with the whole of your CP membership before an outcome proposal is submitted with the aim of reaching a consensus on how funding is spent.

Each project requiring budget, needs to have a Outcome Proposal completed. These need to be completed by a nominated person / task & finish group who sits on that Community Partnership. The CP Chair will be required to sign off on each proposal. It\'s suggested that blank copies of the proposal form are not circulated widely to avoid speculative bids from external organisations.

Unless a grant programme is being run by the CP, the CP's budget is to not to be treated like a grant programme for external organisations to freely submit proposals. This should be tightly controlled by each Chair.

Where organisations are pitching their own project ideas within a CP or one organisation has been identified to deliver a project / activity, the CP needs to ensure that they have considered all the options including other organisations which could potentially deliver that work. It might be that some form of procurement exercise is the best route where multiple organisations are potentially able to deliver.
