Individual Comments

Deprivation

- Child poverty
- Improve services to families
- Hospitality sector – zero hours contract, benefits charger for staff
- Fuel poverty / more focus on fuel poverty and how this links with other challenges x 2

Environment

- Enabling residents to be more engaged in the environment e.g. tree planting
- Better recognition of national and international heritage environmental
- Assets in Sutton Hoo, Bawdsey radar + AONB
- Engage with existing neighbourhood plan areas
- Support tourism

Social Isolation

- Age demographics, pressure on medical services, other support options?
- Anxieties and isolation of young people related to social media
- More community groups addressing isolation
- More activities to reach older people to reduce loneliness and isolation
- Rural isolation, no work, no way to access larger centres
- Community support / spaces x 2
- Ensure transport links to services - lack of buses causes isolation x 2
- Visibility of safe areas for people within towns
- Reducing isolation for all ages
- Rural isolation for young people who do not drive
- Hidden needs for older people, need services, facilities and company

Housing

- Quality of homes / improvements to properties/housing maintenance x 2
- More affordable / social/ social rent homes x 4
- More social housing in rural areas to help young families stay local
- Understand house prices/fuel poverty isolation
- 3,991 waiting for social housing, need more for young people
- Help local residents to remain in the area
- Generational makeup of area directly influenced by age group who can afford higher end housing
- Grants/means tested for older residents to enable them to tackle poor living conditions of homes. Maybe a cap of £500 per household
- Provision of accommodation in Woodbridge/Melton for homeless people

Transport

- Frequency and affordability of public transport
- Transport for young people / young people to college x 2

- Accessible public/community transport that reaches areas where there is social housing
- Analysis of access to public transport and impact on social mobility and isolation
- Lack of village bus service
- More data on the provision of public transport
- Transport promotion and servicing of attractions and facilities
- Wheelchair accessible transport for people with disabilities x 2
- Improved cycle lanes & routes. Segregation from busy roads x 2
- Safe cycling for families and children going to school
- Walk/cycle to work
- General maintains of road signs, hedges and verges
- More access to countryside
- 20mph speed limits
- Traffic enforcement
- Road capacity
- Poor road infrastructure - white lines renewal, potholes x 2, mud and poor signage

ASB/Crime

- Preventative awareness raising within the community regarding County Lines
- Drug use x 2
- Suspected drug use in Alderton
- Increase of ASB
- Safe places for young people
- Crime data
- More engagement with Police / visible police missing x 2

Young people

- Mapping of youth services/activities/support/employment help
- Links to culture and employment
- Data on where the skills are leaking, where qualified young people are settling rather than here
- For under 21's the access and provision for social/out of school activities
- Lack of activities – need better youth facilities, more youth clubs x 2
- Career development support for school leavers, encourage to stay in area
- Providing support and social opportunities for young people in rural areas
- More provision for under 5's and parents

Social care/health

- Social well-being and mental health
- Access to support locally
- Opportunities to bring services to rural areas
- Support for existing organisation who already help residents
- More care packages
- Life expectancy, why the difference between wards, what can we do to change this?
- Needs of and provision for disabled people especially school age

- Visibility of need, public forums and care cafes to discuss need
- Encourage self help in their own health care
- Support people to move from inactive to active

Community Halls

- Upgrade community halls – make use of as activity/social hubs
- Use for pop up events and farmers markets

Dementia

- Encourage dementia diagnosis and support of individuals and carers
- Improve self-management for mental health and dementia
- Dementia friendly communities, access for those living with dementia, use of public spaces
