## YOUTH FACILITIES IN WICKHAM MARKET

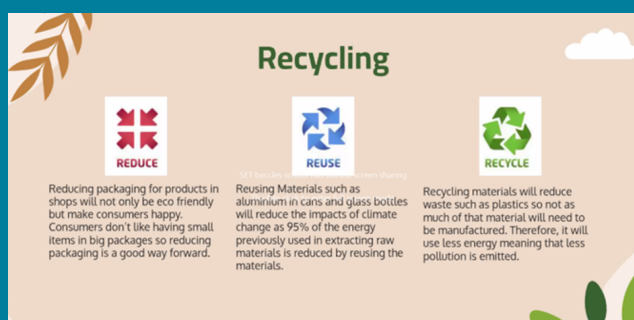
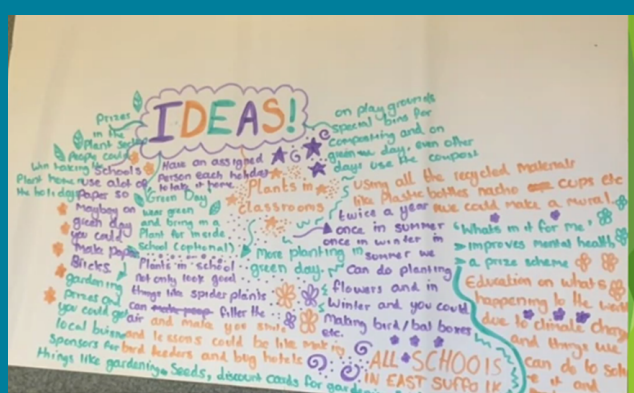

## YOUTH TAKE OVER DAY 2022

On 25th November 2022, East Suffolk Council Communities Team ran the annual Youth Take Over Day. 7 schools from across the district participated in Youth Take Over Day. The challenge for the young people was to put together a big idea around the environment and climate change that they could deliver in their local community to meet the vision of the world in 2070. A judging panel heard presentations and ideas from each school and decided the winner.

The winners of the challenge was Benjamin Britten High School, with SET Beccles and Felixstowe School also featuring in the top 3. The day had great ideas, presentations from University of East Anglia and East Suffolk Council and even a letter from Sir David Attenborough!

East Suffolk Council are now supporting schools on how best they can deliver their ideas.



## YOUTH FACILITIES IN THE NORTH OF THE PATCH

Some villages in the north of the patch like Huntingfield, Chediston, Walpole and Cookley border Halesworth. Some residents from those villages do youth activities in Halesworth. Over the summer of 2022, there was youth research happening in Halesworth to find out what young people want for the future in the town. This will impact young people living in the villages near to Halesworth so we thought it would be good to let you know! Some key points included wanting a youth drop-in in addition to the Apollo Youth Club and making improvements to the skatepark and Town Park. This is currently being actioned by local organisations in Halesworth!
