SAFETY

When asked about any concerns in the local community, responses included:

- Rude comments from unknown people which made them feel uncomfortable
- Loud motorbike noise
- Uneven paths



- The field on Clarkes Lane having its play equipment replaced and improved, as well as perhaps doing something with the rest of the empty field
- More places (not just youth groups) where teenagers can do something other than sport - "a choir may be a good start"
- Picking up litter

We will feed this back to local organisations including the Police and local councillors.



GREEN SPACES

We were asked by Suffolk County Council's Public Health Team to find out more about the impact of green spaces and nature on young people. Some responses included:

- "I find it useful but I don't know how more young people can be encouraged to engage with it locally and safely, although school trips to places like forests maybe only to go for a walk, may be a good idea."
- "There is no greenery in Lowestoft"
- "Have more nature reserves"
- "Create a fun environment in Bonds meadow e.g rope swings, den building
