Joolz Thompson from iFarm joins us to deliver a short talk on the practical steps you can take right now in your community to combat the climate & ecological emergency. Build resilience in your communities by insulating and retrofitting your homes, generating your own heat and power, cultivating your own food and reducing waste. This all starts with a plan.

The event may trigger thoughts about how we create and support resilient communities; where we generate our energy and grow our food locally, and accommodate nature in the process; and what we are prepared to change about the rural and historic nature of Suffolk to achieve this.

We don't claim to have the answers to the big questions ourselves. However we will use this as an opportunity to gather your questions, ideas and comments to help inform the ongoing dialogue within the multi-stakeholder group identifying opportunities for collaborative actions in support of the Suffolk Climate Emergency Plan, and within East Suffolk Council itself.
