EAST SUFFOLK COUNCIL (CLOPTON FOOTPATH 4 (PART)) PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION ORDER 2025

On 10 July 2025 East Suffolk Council confirmed the above order made under Section 119 of the Highways Act 1980.

The effect of the order as confirmed is to divert the entire width of that part of Clopton Public Footpath 4 commencing at Ordnance Survey grid reference (OSGR) TM22575509 and proceeding in a north easterly direction from Shop Road for approximately 150 metres to OSGR TM22705516 and continuing in a north easterly direction for approximately 141 metres to OSGR TM22845520, to a new line running from OSGR reference TM22575505 and proceeding in a north easterly direction for approximately 109 metres from Shop Road to OSGR TM22685508 and continuing in a north easterly direction along the northern side of the field boundary for approximately 189 metres to OSGR TM22865512, with the southern edge of the path commencing 0.5 metres from the field boundary and continuing in a north westerly direction along the western side of the field boundary for a final distance of approximately 90 metres to the aforementioned OSGR TM22845520, with the southern edge of the path commencing 0.5 metres from the field boundary as shown on the order map.

The order comes into force on 9 August 2025 but if a person aggrieved by the order wants to question its validity, or that of any provision contained in it, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1980, as amended, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act, as amended, or of any regulation made under the Act has not been complied with in relation to the order he or she may, under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 6 to the Act, within six weeks from 18 July 2025 make an application to the High Court.
