On 27 September 2023 East Suffolk Council confirmed the above order.

The effect of the order will be to divert the entire width of that part of Nacton Footpath No 1 commencing at Ordnance Survey grid reference (OSGR) TM21744145 on the south side of the railway and proceeding in a south south easterly direction for approximately 305 metres to OSGR TM21854116 just north of the A14 boundary fence to a new line running from OSGR TM21744145 in a south easterly direction for 359 metres to OSGR TM22064128 then in a south south westerly direction for 48 metres to OSGR TM22044124 then in a west south westerly direction for 207 metres to join the existing route at OSGR TM21854116 just north of the A14 boundary fence as described in the order and as shown on the order map.

The order comes into force on the date on which East Suffolk Council certifies that the alternative highway has been created to its reasonable satisfaction, but if any person aggrieved by the order desires to question its validity or that of any provision contained in it on the ground that it is not within the powers of the above Act, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act, or any regulation made under it has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the order he or she may apply to the High Court for any of these purposes under Section 287 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 within 6 weeks from the date on which notice is first published as required by paragraph 7 of Schedule 14 to that Act.
