



Dear Sir/Madam,

On **Sunday 8<sup>th</sup> September** East Suffolk welcomes the **Stage 6 of the Lloyds Bank Tour of Britain Men**. The 20<sup>th</sup> edition of the race will take place over 158 km (98.5 mile) starting in Lowestoft and finishing in Felixstowe.

In order to ensure a safe route for the participants and set up of the infrastructure it is necessary to close the following roads and suspend on street parking between **00:01** and **23:59** on **Sunday 8<sup>th</sup> September** within **Felixstowe:** 

- Micklegate Road (15m from Sea Road)
- Beach Station Road
- Sea Road (Beech Station Road to Undercliff Road West)
- Cavendish Street (Sea Road to Manning Road)
- Manning Road (Cavendish Street to Undercliff Road West)
- Undercliff Road West (Convalescent Hill to Spa Pavilion). Residential access and Spa Pavilion staff will have access during the closure times.

The following roads will closed and street parking suspended between **18:00** on **Saturday 7<sup>th</sup> September** and **23:59 Sunday 8<sup>th</sup> September**:

• Sea Road (Tacon Road to Beech Station Road)

A one-way system will be in place along **Undercliff Road West** travelling **East from Langer Road to Convalescent Hill** until approximately **14:00** when it will close fully. The one-way system will then be reinstated once the race has left at around **17:00**.

All remaining side roads will be open until **20 minutes before the race is due to arrive** and then they will be closed to allow for the participants of the race to come through safely. Once the race has come through, these roads will reopen.

In order to ensure a safe route for the participants, it will be necessary to suspend on street parking on the following roads:







- High Street/High Road West (up to Garrison Lane)
- Garrison Lane/A154 (High Road West to Undercliff Road West)
- Langer Road/A154 (Undercliff Road West to Beech Station Road)

These restrictions will apply between 11:00 and 15:30 on Sunday 8<sup>th</sup> September.

Please find enclosed a plan highlighting the area affected.

To minimise the inconvenience, we will endeavour to remove the cones as soon as practicably possible once the race has passed through.

Please ensure that your vehicles (and any vehicles belonging to visitors you may have) are removed from these areas before the restrictions apply.

The cones will be installed the evening prior to the race and advance warning signage installed two weeks prior.
