

What is local infrastructure?



How to identify need?

What infrastructure is already in the area? (also think wider) What existing facilities might need to be improved (indoor/outdoor)? Are locations good – could it be better elsewhere? What don't you have? What do residents want/need? (top tip – ask them) Consider all types of users – young/old/less abled/families/groups Use a PIIP (Parish Infrastructure Investment Plan)/Consult and record this

Are projects clearly defined/articulated?

Prioritise your projects

What's really triggered through growth? What can be funded through NCIL/DCIL? What should you already be doing? Timing of Housing = £ NCIL/DCIL = paid over a period (2-3yrs or more if phased development) Form small working groups – each focussed to a specific project – share learning Do you need to involve statutory bodies? (Health, Education, Highways etc) Who leads? – if Highways, foot cycle etc – any DCIL bids need to come to East Suffolk via these bodies Be clear on who owns the land, rights and permissions? Is planning permission required? Clarity on timescales to deliver and project stages Question others funding – Schools/Health demands

Fund and Deliver!



Free resource pools, support from others? – architects, surveyors, lawyers, project managers, etc



Collaborative Funding – fundraising events, crowd funding, supermarkets (local projects), lottery, grants, sporting bodies, etc



Timing of Bid Rounds -April-May Annually



Local CIL (£50K max) - must be match funded



District CIL – needs to be in the "made" Neighbourhood Plan and be jointly funded with NCIL.



Neighbourhood CIL has a 5year spend restriction – so don't delay!
