## Adoption of the East Suffolk Council – Suffolk Coastal Local Plan

In accordance with the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004 and the Town and Country Planning (Local Planning) (England) Regulations 2012 (as amended), notice is hereby given that East Suffolk Council adopted the Suffolk Coastal Local Plan on 23<sup>rd</sup> September 2020.

The Suffolk Coastal Local Plan covers the part of East Suffolk formerly covered by Suffolk Coastal district. The Local Plan sets out the level of growth which needs to be planned in the area and identifies where that growth should be located and how it should be delivered. The Local Plan sets out the planning policies which the Council will use to determine planning applications in the Plan area. The Suffolk Coastal Local Plan covers the period 2018-2036. The Local Plan carries full weight in the consideration of planning applications and appeal decisions.

The Local Plan was subject to an independent Examination conducted by Planning Inspector Philip Lewis BA(Hons) MA MRTPI, appointed by the Secretary of State. The Inspector's report was issued on 8<sup>th</sup> September 2020 and concluded that the Local Plan is legally compliant and sound, subject to a number of Main Modifications. These Main Modifications have been incorporated in the final Local Plan.

The Suffolk Coastal Local Plan wholly supersedes the following documents which are no longer part of the development plan:

- Suffolk Coastal Local Plan (incorporating first and second alterations) (2001 and 2006)
- Core Strategy and Development Management Policies (2013)
- Site Allocations and Area Specific Policies (2017)
- Felixstowe Peninsula Area Action Plan (2017)

Any person aggrieved by the Suffolk Coastal Local Plan may make an application under Section 113 of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004 to the High Court on the

grounds that the document is not within the appropriate power and/or a procedural requirement has not been complied with. Any such application must be made within six weeks of the 24<sup>th</sup> September 2020.
