	Members were given a briefing updating them on many of the Transport aspects of the project including the transport figures we have been given in the modelling, the HGV management proposed, rail use, mitigation currently proposed by EDF and the Aecom report on options for B1122/D2. They also heard of the experience at Bridgwater on transport issues. Members wished to meet with Aecom to clarify points in the report. 8.	Workstream update	
	Skills – some work underway with EDF, we plan to have a longer update on this area at the January JLAG, with particular emphasis on what is happening at the schools level. Socio-economic – a meeting with EDF was planned for early January, for an update on the work achieved in 2014 and also the plan for the various elements of this workstream going forward. A fuller update could be brought to the January meeting. The Hinkley deal was mentioned – it was suggested that a future agenda item for JLAG would be future Growth Deals and opportunities. Environment – a number of workshops have been held, particularly on HRA (Habitats Regulation Assessment), Aldhurst Farm and a Bridges workshop where we were disappointed that some work we had asked for in Nov 13 had not yet been completed by EDF.
