5.	Update on workstreams (environment; transport; socio-economic; associated development)	
	Officers updated members on each workstream as follows:	
	<u>Transport</u> – JLAG remains committed to the case for the 4 Villages Bypass, and is continuing to pursue potential sources of funding to enhance EDF's contribution. AECOM report has been presented to EDF, and Mott McDonald first draft has today been received by officers, it will now be analysed and it is hoped to be made available to JLAG at its next meeting.	
	Accommodation – EDF appear to be focussing on one site at the site entrance. JLAG has mixed views on whether a single or multiple site approach is best.	
	<u>Environment</u> – workshops are ongoing. Officers yet to receive full information to understand the extent of environmental impact. Officers working closely with EDF and other environmental organisations to ensure impacts are considered and that EDF acts accordingly. This work is following the 'mitigation hierarchy' which states in order of preference: avoidance, mitigation, and compensation of impacts.

	Socio-economic – officers are ensuring a robust evidence base is in place, showing localised benefits and the likely legacy benefits as a result of the development. This evidence base will inform what local opportunities there are and the training/skills needed to support this. Sizewell C will attract inward investment as a result of which there is likely to be 'innovation clustering'.	

	It was agreed that it would be useful for the LEP to be involved more in discussions on Sizewell C and particularly in the socio-economic area of work.
