	 EDF has an "Aspire" programme targeted at younger school pupils. 	
	 Supply chain – EDF have set up a registration website to attract local companies to apply for opportunities to work with EDF. EDF are appointing a local supply chain development officer in the next few months. 	
	Environment:	
	 There has been discussion around the issue of Alde Hurst 	

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	Farm, following the loss of SSSI and the options available to replace it. Alde Hurst Farm is not felt by members to be the right option to replace it.	
	 Significant comments have been made in workshops regarding quarrying. 	
	 Impacts of recreation – members felt that more scoping is needed by EDF in this respect. 	
	Transport:	
	 AECOM are in dispute with EDF's consultant on the baseline of traffic modelling. They are working to come to an agreed shared model. EDF will not release traffic flow data until such an agreement is reached. Consultants on both sides are meeting on 10th June with a view to reaching agreement. 	
	 District and County members to meet to discuss routes. Members are focussing on what can be done to alleviate traffic problems in the 4 villages. 	
	Associated development:	
	 No significant progress to updates. 	
	 EDF have had discussions with the Port of Felixstowe regarding heavy goods vehicle movements and a lorry park option.
