1.	Introductions and apologies for absence	
	Introductions made and apologies received. The Chairman welcomed the	
	speakers for Item 2	
2.	Presentation on the proposed Planning Aid England support to town and parish councils	
	Phil Pluck introduced himself and the RTPI. They are a membership organisation with 23,000 members. Their Planning Aid England team offers planning advice and support to individuals and communities. They have been commissioned by EDF to work with local parishes and towns to assist them in formulating their own responses to the Stage 2 consultation for Sizewell C.	
	Councillors asked a number of questions about the detail of the proposal. They welcomed the support now being offered to towns and parishes and were supportive of the suggested approach.	
	In answer to a question Tom McGarry, clarified that post Stage 2 EDF Energy would give an overview of the consultation results (as it did following Stage 1) The full report would form part of the Development Consent Order submission for Sizewell C.	
3.	Notes of previous meeting and matters arising	
	Notes of the last meeting held on 20 Nov were approved and would be added to the website	KP
4.	Discussion on Construction strategy	
	Members discussed the position of the local authorities at Stage 1 on the construction issues and then any further EDF Energy statements of preferred options since then.	

	The construction strategy is heavily intertwined with the transport strategy, the accommodation strategy (in particular the proposals for an onsite campus) and the environment strategy. The impacts of the construction strategy will also reach into the socio-economic strategy, insofar as the disruption to this important environmental resource, unless managed carefully, could have consequences for the tourism sector. Members hoped to see more detail on Construction proposals as part of the Stage 2 consultation.	
5.	Discussion on Transport	
	Notwithstanding the links with the Construction topic, members discussed the information available at Stage1 and since on EDF's proposals on Transport. During construction, much of this hinged on the modal split of goods and materials being transported by road, rail or sea and it was very difficult to come to a view on impacts and the "worst case scenario" without this information from EDF Energy.	
	In terms of the Four Villages Bypass, it was reported that the Chamber of	
	Commerce would be hosting two events for businesses in early 2016 to	
	understand local businesses views on the A12's impact on their business.	
6.	Workstream updates	
	Environment –	
	Officers outlined some of the recent Environment work stream meetings and the issues arising from them.  Socio-economic — Officers were separating their thinking on the impacts into the Construction and Operational phases	
7.	JLAG tour	
	New members of JLAG had found their recent tour of the AD sites and the main development site very helpful. EDF had offered a further tour after the Stage 2 consultation phase.
