<sup>1.</sup> Cllr Holdcroft welcomed members to the meeting and thanked them for their contributions for the past year as this will be the last meeting of JLAG this municipal year.

- 2. Notes of meeting 22 February 2019 were agreed.
- 3. Update from Cllr Holdcroft, the vote at Suffolk Coastal Cabinet on 11 March was unanimous in support of the report. Cllr Holdcroft was pleased to have support from Suffolk County Council Councillors and Officers on the night.
- 4. Update from Cllr R Smith, the vote at Suffolk County Council Cabinet on Tuesday 12 March was unanimous in support of the report. TEAGs (Theberton and Eastbridge Action Group) and TASC (Together Against Sizewell C) were both present. TASC had earlier submitted a

1500 signature petition against Sizewell C to SCC. There was a similar debate to that held at SCDC lasting approximately 2 hours.

- 5. A tracked changes version of the Stage 3 response (under delegated Authority given at both Cabinet meetings) will be circulated to JLAG members prior to submission to EDF Energy. The Fire and Rescue Service will be submitting a separate response to the proposals which focuses on traffic, highways, freight management facility, rail-led, land contamination, drainage, helipad, likely impact with regards to road traffic collisions, emergency response etc. It aligns with the joint SCDC and SCC response.
- 6. Monthly meetings covering all aspects of the Sizewell C proposals including transport, socioeconomic and environmental aspects are being set with EDF Energy, there will be ongoing engagement with JLAG envisioned at least until the end of the year. An issues log is being formulated based on our Stage 3 response and using a red, amber, green classification system.
