# Sizewell C update to JLAG members, June 2021

#### Start of examination

The Examination formally commenced on 15<sup>th</sup> April 2021, following two Preliminary Meetings. It is due to complete by the end of the period of 6 months, on 14 October 2021.

### Submission of LIR (12 May 2021)

At Deadline 1 on12 May the two Councils submitted a joint Local Impact Report to the Examining Authority (ExA). This document was the culmination of months of work, synthesising input from dozens of technical experts from across Suffolk County Council and East Suffolk Council. This document is comprehensive in scope and totals 180,000 words and 530 pages.

#### Open Floor Hearings (18-21 May 2021)

Open Floor Hearings were held by the ExA over the course of four days. Cllr Richard Rout and Cllr Craig Rivett represented the views of the two Councils respectively, the remainder of the hearings were an opportunity for members of the community to put their concerns directly to the ExA. ## Submission of responses to ExA's Questions and Written Representation at Deadline 2 (2 June 2021)

In April the ExA issued a set of over 2,000 questions, of which more than 300 were directed at the Councils. Both Councils submitted responses at the beginning of June and are in the process of reviewing answers provided by the Applicant and other parties.

#### **Initial Statement of Common Ground**

The Applicant has worked with the Councils on an initial joint Statement of Common Ground, which indicates for each statement whether each of the Councils is in agreement, not in agreement, or discussions are progressing. It will be revised and evolved at further points during the Examination process before being signed and submitted in its final version towards the end of the Examination.

## **Accompanied Site Inspections**

The ExA on 8 to 10 June carried out accompanied site inspections (ASI) at Sizewell C, which included the main development site, construction areas and associated development sites. The purpose of these inspections was an opportunity for the Applicant and Interested Parties to point out specific features etc., but participants were not permitted to discuss the merits of the proposals. Both Councils were represented by officers throughout the ASI's.

On 20 June, there is an additional ASI for the ExA to view the Hinkley Point C construction site. Philip Ridley and Michael Moll will be representing the two Councils at this ASI.

## **Upcoming dates:**

Consultation on the Applicant's second request for proposed additional project changes (11 June to 12 July 2021): The Applicant is consulting the public on a number of specific, relatively minor, changes to their application, in relation to Lovers Lane and Bridleway 19, minor changes to PRoW proposals and flood relief culverts at the Two Village Bypass, and Sizewell Link Road changes related to Pretty Road bridge, PRoW proposal, drainage and highway works. There is a notification of these proposed changes to be responded to at D3, the Councils will give initial responses to these changes at this time. However, they have not yet been formally submitted or accepted into the Examination process, and full updated Environmental Statement information is not yet available. **Deadline 3 (24 June 2021):** Includes: opportunity to comment on responses to the ExA's questions (which includes those questions not directed to the Councils), comment on Written Representations, initial Statements of Common Ground and further submissions received from the Applicant.

**Issue Specific Hearings (6-16 July 2021):** The first set of ISHs covers: DCO, S106/Deed of obligation, traffic and transport, socio-economic and community issues, Landscape and visual impacts and design, coastal geomorphology and biodiversity and ecology. Both Councils will field their relevant technical officers, orchestrated by each of their QCs.

It has been confirmed, due to continued COVID restrictions, that these ISHs will be held virtually.
